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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the First in Your Family Florida Medical School Scholarship and Grant Program; creating s. 1009.899, F.S.; establishing the First in Your Family Florida Medical School Scholarship and Grant Program within the Department of Education for specified purposes; requiring the department to award scholarships to certain students enrolled in specified schools or programs; providing requirements for such scholarships; requiring the department to establish specified criteria for the program; authorizing the department to provide grants to certain postsecondary educational institutions or nonprofit organizations to create and implement nontraditional mentoring services or support programs for specified purposes; providing a maximum grant amount through the program; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Florida's population is growing and, according to the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability, there will be an anticipated shortfall of 18,000 physicians by 2035, and

WHEREAS, the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability spent more than a year collecting data related to the state's graduate medical education programs and

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concluded that "Florida's physician workforce is inadequate to meet projected demand," and

WHEREAS, the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability reported that the shortage of physicians in this state could affect citizens' access to health care if current trends persist, with a supply of physicians to meet only 77 percent of the projected demand for physicians in Florida by 2035, and

WHEREAS, there were some 835,000 practicing doctors in American in 2023, according to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, and the United States is currently experiencing a shortage of practicing doctors because demand exceeds supply, NOW THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

## Section 1. Section 1009.899, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.899 The First in Your Family Florida Medical School Scholarship and Grant Program.—

(1) There is established the First in Your Family Florida
Medical School Scholarship and Grant Program to be administered
by the Department of Education to provide scholarships to
students who are the first in their families to be enrolled in
an in-state or out-of-state accredited medical school or

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approved physician assistant program and to create nontraditional mentoring services or support programs for certain students.

- who are the first in their families to be enrolled in an instate or out-of-state accredited medical school or approved physician assistant program that will lead to licensure under chapter 458 or chapter 459. The scholarship amount shall be determined by the department. Priority shall be given to students who are enrolled in an accredited medical school in the state and who graduated from a public or private postsecondary educational institution in the state in the last 5 years. The department shall establish criteria for the program, which must include:
- (a) Student eligibility criteria, including, but not limited to, requirements that the applicant:
- 1. Be the first in his or her family to be enrolled in an in-state or out-of-state accredited medical school or approved physician assistant program.
  - 2. Be a United States citizen.
- (b) Program and scholarship award requirements, including, but not limited to, that:
- 1. Awards must be income-based for students whose annual household income is less than \$150,000.
  - 2. Two-thirds of the scholarships that are available and

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awarded through the program must be to students who are enrolled in an in-state medical school or physician assistant program at a public postsecondary educational institution.

- 3. One-third of the scholarships that are available and awarded through the program must be to students who are enrolled in an out-of-state medical school or physician assistant program at a public or private postsecondary educational institution.
- 4. Preference shall be given to students enrolled at instate accredited medical schools and approved physician assistant programs at public educational institutions.
  - 5. Scholarship award funds shall be dispersed as follows:
- a. Fifty percent of the total scholarship award shall be paid after September 1 of each year when the enrollment of the student has been verified.
- b. Twenty five percent of the total scholarship award shall be paid in January of each year.
- c. Twenty five percent of the total scholarship award shall be paid in June of each year.
- 6. A scholarship may be awarded and renewed for a total of 4 years, based upon proof of enrollment or continued enrollment in an accredited medical school or approved physician assistant program.
- 7. A student receiving an award through the program may use up to \$5,000 of the scholarship for emergency funds for students experiencing an emergency or a financial crisis,

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including, but not limited to, issues relating to a student's car, housing, and health care.

- 8. A student receiving an award through the program may use up to \$2,500 of the scholarship for fees, kits, coats, clothing, medical bag, blood pressure kits, drug testing, or disability insurance.
- organizations under s. 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code to create and implement nontraditional mentoring services or support programs to assist students who are enrolled in an accredited medical school or approved physician assistant program at a public educational institution in the state. A grant awarded under this subsection may not exceed \$100,000.
- Section 2. For the 2025-2026 fiscal year, and each fiscal year thereafter, the sum of \$10,000,000 in recurring funds is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Education for the purpose of implementing the First in Your Family Florida Medical School Scholarship and Grant Program.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
