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rules for standards of care; providing specified criteria for such rules; requiring the department to inspect a dog breeding facility; authorizing the department to enter such facility; requiring probable cause for such entry; authorizing the department to take certain enforcement actions against a dog breeding facility; authorizing the department to assess fines; authorizing the department to enter into cooperative agreements to conduct such inspections and board confiscated dogs; authorizing the department to create a risk-based inspection frequency system; authorizing the department to suspend or revoke certificates of registration and certificates of inspection under certain circumstances; requiring the department to establish an expedited review system for confiscated dogs; requiring the department to create a publicly available database on its website which contains certain information; requiring the department to establish a whistleblower program for reporting certain violations; creating s. 585.715, F.S.; requiring dog breeders and dog breeding facilities to microchip certain dogs; requiring such microchips to be registered with the department; requiring a retail establishment to conspicuously post certain certificates of registration and certificates of

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inspection; prohibiting a retail establishment from selling or accepting for sale a dog that does not meet the microchipping requirements; providing civil penalties; creating s. 585.716, F.S.; prohibiting an individual from transferring a dog at specified locations; providing exceptions; creating s. 585.717, F.S.; providing for enforcement; authorizing civil and criminal penalties; authorizing law enforcement agencies and local animal control departments to enter into an agreement with the department to obtain reimbursement for enforcement costs; amending s. 585.007, F.S.; conforming a provision to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Part III of chapter 585, Florida Statutes, consisting of ss. 585.71-585.718, Florida Statutes, is created and entitled "Dog Breeding."

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Section 2. Section 585.71, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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585.71 Legislative findings and intent.—

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(1) The Legislature finds that:

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(a) Breeding dogs for profit without regard for the condition in which the dogs live or how they are cared for is an

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act of animal cruelty.

- (b) The registration of individuals or corporations that breed dogs for profit is necessary to prevent the cruel treatment of dogs, to prevent bred dogs that end up in shelters from being euthanized at a financial cost to local governmental entities and this state, and to prevent the emotional suffering of individuals and families that experience the unethical and bad business practices of some dog breeders.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to require any individual or corporation that breeds dogs for profit to register with the department and for dog breeding facilities to be inspected by the department to ensure that quality standards are met and that only qualified individuals and facilities are authorized to breed dogs to reduce the number of sick and unwanted dogs in this state.
- Section 3. Section 585.711, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 585.711 Definitions.—As used in this part, the term:
- (1) "Breeding female dog" means a dog that has not been spayed and is more than 6 months old and capable of reproduction.
- (2) "Certificate of inspection" means an official document issued by the department to a dog breeding facility stipulating compliance with this part and department rules.
 - (3) "Certificate of registration" means an official

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101	document issued by the department to a dog breeder as evidence
102	of such dog breeder being properly registered with the
103	department in compliance with this part and department rules.
104	(4) "Consideration" means anything of value including cash,

- dog possessed by a dog breeder is presumed to be used for breeding purposes unless the dog breeder establishes to the satisfaction of the department, based on the dog breeder's breeding records or other evidence reasonably acceptable to the department, that the dog is not used for breeding.
- Section 5. Section 585.713, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 585.713 Certificate of registration and inspection.-
- (1) Each dog breeder within this state must apply to the department, on a form supplied by the department, for a certificate of registration.
- (2) The certificate of registration must be renewed annually on its anniversary date upon satisfactorily showing that the applicant has complied with this part and department rules.
- (3) The department shall provide to each dog breeder subject to this section a written notice and renewal form no less than 60 days before the annual renewal date, which informs the dog breeder of the certificate of registration renewal date.

To enter a dog breeding facility under this section, there must be probable cause.
- (b) Declare a dog breeding facility noncompliant and provide the registered facility owner or operator with an opportunity to cure the noncompliance within 10 days.
 - (c) Assess fines.

- (1) A dog breeder or dog breeding facility must fit each breeding female dog or any dog that it intends to offer for sale with a unique microchip and register the unique microchip with the department.
- (2) A retail establishment that sells dogs in this state must do all of the following:
- (a) Conspicuously post in a place that is in clear and unobstructed public view any certificates of registration and certificates of inspection of dog breeders and dog breeding facilities, respectively, from which the retail establishment obtains dogs for sale.
- (b) Ensure that any dog offered for sale in the retail establishment is fitted with a unique microchip by the dog breeder or dog breeding facility pursuant to subsection (1). The retail establishment may not sell or accept for sale any dog which does not have a microchip that is registered with the department.
- (c) Provide a certificate of veterinary inspection for each dog offered for sale.
- (3) (a) Any individual who violates paragraph (2) (a) may be subject to a fine as established by the department.
- (b) A retail establishment that violates subsection (2) is subject to a Class I fine pursuant to s. 570.971. Each dog offered for sale in violation of subsection (2) constitutes a

- department imposing a fine pursuant to this part must specify the amount of the fine and the time limit for payment, which may not exceed 15 days. Upon failure to pay the fine within the time limit, the dog breeder certificate of registration or the dog breeding facility certificate of inspection may be suspended or revoked without further hearing. Section 10. Subsection (1) of section 585.007, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

585.007 Violation of rules; violation of chapter.-

- (1) <u>Unless otherwise provided by law</u>, a person who violates this chapter or any rule of the department <u>is</u> shall be subject to the imposition of an administrative fine in the Class III category pursuant to s. 570.971 for each offense. Upon repeated violation, the department may seek enforcement pursuant to s. 120.69.
