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- (3) The Department of Law Enforcement must impose a fine of \$10,000 for each violation of this section. The department must use the moneys collected from these fines to provide compensation to victims of unauthorized aliens pursuant to s. 908.13.
- Section 2. Section 908.13, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
  - 908.13 Compensation for victims of unauthorized aliens.-
- (1) As used in this section, the term "unauthorized alien" has the same meaning as in s. 908.111(1).
- (2) The Department of Law Enforcement is authorized to develop a program to compensate residents who have suffered a harm caused by an unauthorized alien.
- (3) In order to be eligible for compensation under this section:
- (a) The act or omission which caused the harm must have occurred in this state on or after July 1, 2025.
- (b) The preponderance of the evidence must show that an unauthorized alien materially contributed to the harm for which compensation is sought.
- (c) The person seeking compensation must complete a form prescribed by the Department of Law Enforcement.
- (4) The Department of Law Enforcement shall develop rules to administer this section.
