 2 An act relating to reproductive health care; creating
 3 s. 381.4022, F.S.; providing a short title; defining
 4 the term "reproductive health care"; providing that
 5 individuals have specified reproductive rights;
 6 providing construction; prohibiting a local government
 7 from regulating an individual's reproductive freedom;
 8 providing an effective date.

 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 12 **Section 1. Section 381.4022, Florida Statutes, is created**
 13 **to read:**

14 381.4022 Reproductive health care.—

15 (1) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the "Protect
 16 Reproductive Options Act."

17 (2) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section, the term
 18 "reproductive health care" means health care offered, arranged,
 19 or furnished for the purpose of preventing pregnancy,
 20 terminating a pregnancy, managing pregnancy loss, or improving
 21 maternal health and birth outcomes. The term includes, but is
 22 not limited to, contraception, sterilization, preconception
 23 care, maternity care, abortion care, family planning and
 24 fertility services, and counseling regarding reproductive
 25 health.

26 (3) REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM.—

27 (a) An individual has a fundamental right to make
28 autonomous decisions about the individual's own reproductive
29 health, including the fundamental right to use or refuse
30 reproductive health care.

31 (b) An individual who becomes pregnant has a fundamental
32 right to continue the pregnancy and give birth, or obtain an
33 abortion, and to make autonomous decisions about how to exercise
34 this fundamental right.

35 (4) CONSTRUCTION.—The State Constitution establishes the
36 principles of individual liberty, personal privacy, and
37 equality. Such principles ensure the fundamental right to
38 reproductive freedom.

39 (5) LIMITATION.—A local government may not regulate an
40 individual's ability to freely exercise the fundamental rights
41 provided in this section in a manner that is more restrictive
42 than this section.

43 **Section 2.** This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
