A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the failure to comply with a time-sharing schedule; amending s. 61.13, F.S.; providing a civil cause of action for a parent's failure or refusal to comply with a court-ordered time-sharing schedule; providing affirmative defenses; providing for retroactivity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (10) is added to section 61.13, Florida Statutes, to read:

61.13 Support of children; parenting and time-sharing; powers of court.—

(10) If a parent fails or refuses to honor a court-ordered time-sharing schedule in a parenting plan without proper cause, the nonoffending parent may bring a civil action against the parent who failed or refused to honor the court-ordered schedule for appropriate compensatory and punitive damages. The offending parent may raise an affirmative defense for his or her actions based on the defenses provided in s. 787.03(4). This subsection applies retroactively to January 1, 2014.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
