Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Paragraph (q) is added to subsection (3) of section 1002.20, Florida Statutes, to read:

1002.20 K-12 student and parent rights.-Parents of public school students must receive accurate and timely information regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12

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	an anaphylactic reaction and administering an epinephrine auto-
22	injector. Each district school board and charter school
23	governing board shall also require that, for each student in
24	kindergarten through grade 8 who has an emergency action plan
25	for anaphylaxis, such plan must be in effect and accessible at
26	all times when the student is on school grounds during the
27	school day or participating in school-sponsored activities. This
28	includes extracurricular activities, athletics, school dances,
29	and contracted before-school or after-school programs at the
30	student's school.
31	2. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the
32	Department of Health, shall adopt rules to implement this
33	paragraph, including identifying an approved training
34	curriculum, by October 1, 2025.
