23	Section 1. Section 288.9964, Florida Statutes, is created
24	to read:
25	288.9964 Internet connectivity in underserved farming
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26	communities			
27	(1) This section may be cited as the "Farming Community			
28	Connectivity Innovation Act."			
29	(2) The Legislature finds that:			
30	(a) Access to high-speed broadband Internet service is			
31	essential for agricultural operations as well as rural economic			
32	development.			
33	(b) Underserved farming communities face significant			
34	challenges due to limited access to broadband Internet service.			
35	(c) Public-private partnerships and targeted incentives			
36	can drive innovation and improve connectivity in rural areas.			
37	(3) For purposes of this section, the term:			
38	(a) "Broadband-enabled technologies" means digital tools			
39	and systems used in agriculture, including precision farming,			
40	smart irrigation, and automated machinery.			
41	(b) "Broadband infrastructure project" means a project			
42	that builds or upgrades the necessary physical network			
43	infrastructure to deliver broadband services in a defined area.			
44	(c) "Eligible applicant" means a public-private			
45	partnership, local government, or a cooperative organization			
46	that proposes a broadband infrastructure project, which may			
47	include broadband-enabled technologies.			
48	(d) "Underserved farming community" means a farming area			
49	with limited or no access to high-speed broadband Internet			
50	services.			

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51	(4)(a) There is created within the Florida Office of				
52	Broadband, a state-funded grant program. The purpose of the				
53	grant program is to fund broadband infrastructure projects in				
54	underserved farming communities.				
55	1. To be eligible to receive grant funds, an eligible				
56	applicant must demonstrate a commitment to serving underserved				
57	farming communities and must outline a plan for maintaining				
58	existing infrastructure.				
59	2. The office must give funding priority to public-private				
60	partnerships and cooperative organizations.				
61	3. Total funding for the grant program may not exceed $$50$				
62	million annually.				
63	(b) Recipients under the state-funded grant program must				
64	submit annual progress reports detailing project milestones,				
65	expenditures, and broadband access improvements.				
66	(c) The office must conduct performance audits to ensure				
67	funds are used effectively and equitably.				
68	(5)(a) A farmer in an underserved farming community who				
69	purchases, installs, or maintains broadband-enabled technologies				
70	may receive state tax credits of up to \$10,000 annually.				
71	(b) Eligible expenses include the purchase, installation,				
72	and maintenance of agricultural equipment that incorporate				
73	broadband-enabled technologies.				
74	(6) The office must:				
75	(a) Conduct public awareness campaigns to inform rural				
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76	communities about grant opportunities and inform farmers in			
77	underserved farming communities about the tax credits.			
78	(b) Provide technical training programs to help farmers			
79	adopt and use broadband-enabled technologies.			
80	(7) This section shall remain in effect until December 31,			
81	2030, unless extended or amended by the Legislature.
