An act relating to high-speed broadband development incentives; creating s. 288.9964, F.S.; providing a short title; providing legislative findings; defining terms; creating a state-funded grant program within the Florida Office of Broadband; providing a purpose for the program; providing eligibility criteria; requiring the office to give funding priority to specified partnerships and organizations; specifying limits on annual funding; requiring funding recipients to provide annual progress reports containing specified information; requiring the office to conduct performance audits; authorizing farmers in underserved farming communities to receive specified tax credits if certain conditions are met; specifying projects eligible for tax credits; requiring the office to conduct specified public awareness campaigns and provide technical training programs; providing an expiration date; providing an effective date.

Section 1. Section 288.9964, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

25 <u>288.9964 Rural connectivity.-</u>

- (1) This section may be cited as the "Rural Connectivity Innovation Act."
  - (2) The Legislature finds that:
  - (a) Access to high-speed broadband Internet service is

essential for modern agricultural operations as well as rural economic development.

- (b) Underserved farming communities face significant challenges due to limited access to broadband Internet service.
- (c) Public-private partnerships and targeted incentives can drive innovation and improve connectivity in rural areas.
  - (3) For purposes of this section, the term:
- (a) "Broadband-enabled technologies" means digital tools and systems used in agriculture, including precision farming, smart irrigation, and automated machinery.
- (b) "Eligible applicant" means a public-private
  partnership, a local government, or a cooperative organization
  that proposes a broadband infrastructure project, which may
  include broadband-enabled technologies.
- (c) "Underserved farming community" means a rural farming area with limited or no access to high-speed broadband Internet services.
- (4) (a) There is created within the Florida Office of Broadband a state-funded grant program. The purpose of the grant program is to fund broadband infrastructure projects in underserved communities, including underserved farming communities.
- 1. To be eligible to receive grant funds, an applicant must demonstrate a commitment to serving underserved communities and must outline a plan for maintaining existing infrastructure.
- 2. The office must give funding priority to public-private partnerships and cooperative organizations.
- 3. Total funding for the grant program may not exceed \$50 million annually.

(b) Recipients under the state-funded grant program must submit annual progress reports detailing project milestones, expenditures, and broadband access improvements.

- (c) The office must conduct performance audits to ensure funds are used effectively and equitably.
- (5) (a) A farmer in an underserved farming community who purchases, installs, or maintains broadband-enabled technologies may receive state tax credits of up to \$10,000 annually.
- (b) Eligible expenses for tax credits include the purchase, installation, and maintenance of broadband-enabled technologies.
  - (6) The office must:
- (a) Conduct public awareness campaigns to inform rural communities about grant opportunities and inform farmers in underserved farming communities about the tax credits.
- (b) Provide technical training programs to help farmers adopt and use broadband-enabled technologies.
- (7) This section shall remain in effect until December 31, 2030, unless extended or amended by the Legislature.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
