These auxiliary enterprises are business activities of a university which require no support from the General Revenue Fund, and include activities such as housing, bookstores, student health services, continuing education programs, food services, college stores, operation of vending machines, specialty shops, day care centers, golf courses, student activities programs, data center operations, and intercollegiate athletics programs.
- (b) Each university board of trustees may determine whether its auxiliary enterprises, including intercollegiate athletics programs, will be self-supporting on an individual or collective basis. A university board of trustees may approve the transfer of unreserved cash from one auxiliary enterprise to support another auxiliary enterprise as long as such transfer does not reduce revenues necessary to cover all expenditures of the auxiliary enterprise, violate any bond covenants, or impact debt service payments and required reserves.
