Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 145.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

145.012 Applicability.—This chapter applies to all officials herein designated in all counties of the state, except those officials whose salaries are not subject to being set by the Legislature because of the provisions of a county home rule charter and except officials (other than the property appraiser, clerk of the circuit court, superintendent of schools, sheriff, supervisor of elections, and tax collector who if qualified shall receive in addition to their salaries a special qualification salary as provided in this chapter) of counties which have a chartered consolidated form of government as

Section 2. Section 145.031, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

145.031 Board of county commissioners.-

provided in chapter 67-1320, Laws of Florida.

(1) (a) Each member of the board of county commissioners of a noncharter county shall receive as salary the amount indicated, based on the population of his or her county. In addition, compensation shall be made for population increments over the minimum for each population group, which shall be determined by multiplying the population in excess of the minimum for the grouping times the group rate.

Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 145.19, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (3) is added to that section, to read:

145.19 Annual percentage increases based on increase for state career service employees; limitation; exception.—

- (2) Each fiscal year, the salaries of all officials listed in this chapter, s. 1001.395, and s. 1001.47, except members of boards of county commissioners, shall be adjusted. The adjusted salary rate shall be the product, rounded to the nearest dollar, of the salary rate granted by the appropriate section of this chapter, s. 1001.395, or s. 1001.47 multiplied first by the initial factor, then by the cumulative annual factor, and finally by the annual factor. The Department of Management Services shall certify the annual factor and the cumulative annual factors. Any special qualification salary received under this chapter, s. 1001.47, or the annual performance salary incentive available to elected superintendents under s. 1001.47 shall be added to such adjusted salary rate. The special qualification salary shall be \$2,000, but may shall not exceed \$2,000.
- (3) The salary adjustment for each member of a board of county commissioners of a noncharter county or a charter county

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that has adopted the salary rate for noncharter counties by

charter or ordinance shall be calculated as provided in

subsection (2) until September 30, 2025. As of October 1, 2025,

any future adjustment shall be made only as provided in s.

Section 4. Section 145.20, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 145.20 Referendum to increase salary, retirement benefits, or other compensation.—
- (1) A board of county commissioners may not increase the salary, any retirement benefit, or any other type of compensation paid to its members unless such increase is approved by a majority of the electors of the county voting in a referendum held at a general election during a presidential election year. The election costs of the referendum shall be paid by the county.
- (2) This section does not apply to any increase in a retirement benefit received as part of the governing body's participation in the Florida Retirement System.

Section 5. Subsection (10) is added to section 166.021, Florida Statutes, to read:

166.021 Powers.-

increase the salary, any retirement benefit, or any other type of compensation paid to its members unless such increase is approved by a majority of the electors of the municipality voting in a referendum held at a general election during a presidential election year. The election costs of the referendum shall be paid by the municipality.

Section 6. Section 189.0165, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

189.0165 Special districts; compensation of members of governing body.—

- (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the governing body of a special district may not increase the salary, any pension or other retirement benefit, or any other type of compensation paid to members of the governing of a special district unless such increase is approved by a majority of the electors of the special district voting in a referendum held at a general election during a presidential election year. The election costs of the referendum shall be paid by the special district.
- (2) This section does not apply to any increase in a retirement benefit received as part of the governing body's participation in the Florida Retirement System.
- (3) This section does not authorize a referendum to increase the salary, any pension or retirement benefit, or any other type of compensation paid to members of the governing body of a special district if the special district's charter prohibits such members from receiving compensation or benefits.

Section 7. This act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
