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 An act relating to guaranteed income programs; creating s. 414.61, F.S.; defining the terms "guaranteed income program" and "local government"; prohibiting a local government from adopting or enforcing a law, an ordinance, a resolution, an order, or a rule that has the purpose or effect of providing for payments under a guaranteed income program; authorizing the Attorney General to send a cease and desist order to a local government that violates specified provisions; authorizing the Attorney General to bring an action for injunctive relief for failure to comply with such cease and desist order; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Section 414.61, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 414.61 Prohibition on guaranteed income programs.-
 - (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Guaranteed income program" means a program under which an individual is issued an unconditional cash payment on a regular basis to be used for any purpose by the individual. The term does not include a program under which an individual is required to seek reemployment, perform work, or attend training as a condition of a cash payment.
- (b) "Local government" means a county, municipality, special district, or political subdivision of the state.

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(2) Unless expressly authorized by state law, a local government may not adopt or enforce a law, an ordinance, a resolution, an order, or a rule that has the purpose or effect of providing for payments to an individual under a guaranteed income program.

(3) The Attorney General shall send a cease and desist order to any local government that adopts or enforces a law, an ordinance, a resolution, an order, or a rule in violation of this section. If the local government fails to comply with the cease and desist order, the Attorney General shall bring an action for injunctive relief against such local government.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
