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An act relating to health care during a declared emergency; amending s. 252.358, F.S.; providing legislative intent; defining the term "life sustaining medical services"; requiring certain health insurance entities to enact specified policies; requiring that such policies be in effect under specified circumstances; authorizing the Office of Insurance Regulation and the Agency for Health Care Administration to issue emergency orders extending the time periods of such policies for specified

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 252.358, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

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252.358 Emergency-preparedness <u>health care</u> prescription medication refills.—

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(1) It is the intent of the Legislature to preserve access to life-sustaining medical care and services during emergencies.

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(2) As used in this section, the term "life-sustaining medical services" includes hospital care, skilled nursing, inpatient rehabilitation, long-term acute care and other post-acute care needs, durable medical equipment and supplies, home health services, hospital services, nursing facility services, chemotherapy, dialysis services, and other care deemed by the provider as medically necessary.

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(3) All health insurers, managed care organizations, and

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other entities that are licensed by the Office of Insurance Regulation, plans participating in the state Medicaid managed care program, and any other health care insurance program administered, regulated, or licensed by the state shall enact the following policies:

- (a) The waiver of and provide prescription medication coverage as part of a policy or contract shall waive time restrictions on prescription medication refills, which include suspension of electronic "refill too soon" edits to pharmacies, to enable insureds or subscribers to refill prescriptions in advance, if there are authorized refills remaining, and authorizing shall authorize payment to pharmacies for at least a 30-day supply of any prescription medication, regardless of the date upon which the prescription had most recently been filled by a pharmacist.
- (b) The waiver of all prior authorization, utilization management, and concurrent review requirements for patients who need life-sustaining medical services.
 - (c) The waiver of authorizations for transfers.
- (d) The waiver of timely filing requirements around notice of admission not less than 30 days after the declaration of an emergency.
- (e) The waiver of filing deadlines and appeal timeframes during a situation described in subsection (4).
- (f) The extension of any authorization or precertification provided before the applicable emergency for a period of 30 days after the conclusion of the events described in paragraph (4)(a).
 - (g) The reimbursement to hospitals for care provided due to

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discharge delays resulting from the events described in paragraph (4)(a).

- (h) The waiver of out of network cost share for patients displaced due to events described in paragraph (4)(a).
- (i) Any additional policy required by the Office of Insurance Regulation or the Agency for Health Care Administration.
- (4) The policies required by subsection (3) must be in effect, when the following conditions occur:
- (a) (1) The person seeking <u>life-sustaining medical services</u> the prescription medication refill resides in a county that:
- $\underline{1.}$ (a) Is under a hurricane warning issued by the National Weather Service;
- 2.(b) Is declared to be under a state of emergency in an executive order issued by the Governor; or
- 3.(e) Has activated its emergency operations center and its emergency management plan.
- (b) (2) The life-sustaining medical service prescription medication refill is requested within 30 days after the origination date of the conditions stated in this section or until such conditions are terminated by the issuing authority or no longer exist. The time period for the policies required by subsection (3) the waiver of prescription medication refills may be extended in 15- or 30-day increments by emergency orders issued by the Office of Insurance Regulation or the Agency for Health Care Administration.

This section does not excuse or exempt an insured or subscriber from compliance with all other terms of the policy or contract
