5	WHEREAS, in 1975, a dozen like-minded businesswomen in the
6	Washington, D.C., area gathered to share information and create
7	an atmosphere of professional community and to further and
8	strengthen their entrepreneurial interests, and
9	WHEREAS, this group quickly grew to become what is now
10	known as the National Association of Women Business Owners
11	(NAWBO), and
12	WHEREAS, in 1988, NAWBO played a key role in the passage of
13	the Women's Business Ownership Act, also known as H.R. 5050,
14	which allowed women to receive business loans without the
15	cosignature of a male relative, and
16	WHEREAS, the federal legislation also created the National
17	Women's Business Council, a panel of women entrepreneurs and
18	women's organizations which provides counsel to the President
19	and members of Congress, and
20	WHEREAS, over the past 40 years, NAWBO, through its
21	affiliation with the World Association of Women Entrepreneurs,
22	has extended its global reach to 60 countries on five continents
23	and has expanded across the United States, boasting a chapter in
24	nearly every major metropolitan area including three chapters in
25	Florida: South Florida, Orlando, and Greater Tampa Lakeland, and
26	WHEREAS, NAWBO strongly supports the achievement of state
27	and federal procurement goals for women-owned small businesses
28	and other steps designed to ensure that women business owners
29	win their fair share of state and federal contracts, realizing

36	innovative and effective change in the business culture;
