## **I.Amendments Contained in Message:**

House Amendment 746971 to Senate Amendment 212806.

## **II.Summary of Amendments Contained in Message:**

House Amendment 746971 amendment removes the SB language and replaces it with the most of the original House language.

The amendment provides it is a second degree misdemeanor to leave the scene of a vessel accident with property damage only. The SB provided this crime was a first degree misdemeanor.

The amendment provides a person who leaves the scene of a vessel accident resulting in death must be sentenced to a man/min of 4 years imprisonment. The SB did not have this provision.

The amendment removed provisions in the SB that provided it was a third degree felony to give a false statement regarding leaving the scene of a vessel accident.

The amendment provides a person who gives false information to information required under ch. 327, commits a second degree mm. The SB does not contain this provision.

The amendment provides it is a third degree misdemeanor to commit the offense of reckless boating with SBI. The SB provided this was a second degree felony and ranked it as a Level 2.

The amendment adds death of an unborn child to BUI manslaughter and provides that a person who is convicted of BUI manslaughter must serve a min/man of 4 years. The SB did not have these provisions.

The amendment provides that any person born before 1988 and who has not been a resident of Florida for at least five consecutive years, must have specified documentation to operate a boat.
