The sum of \$296,400 is appropriated from the 65 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Children and Families for the relief of Michael Barnett, individually and as the 66 natural parent and legal guardian of R.B., for injuries and 67 68 damages sustained. 69 Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to draw 70 a warrant in favor of Michael Barnett and R.B. in the sum of 71 \$296,400 upon funds of the Department of Children and Families 72 in the State Treasury and to pay the same out of such funds in 73 the State Treasury. 74 Section 4. The amount paid by the Department of Children and Families pursuant to s. 768.28, Florida Statutes, and the 75 76 amount awarded under this act are intended to provide the sole 77 compensation for all present and future claims arising out of 78 the factual situation described in this act which resulted in 79 injuries and damages to Michael Barnett and R.B. The total 80 amount paid for attorney fees relating to this claim may not exceed 25 percent of the total amount awarded under this act. 81 82 Section 5.
