"Distribute" has the same meaning as in s. 893.02. 19 The unlawful killing of a human being, when 20 perpetrated without any design to effect death, which resulted 21 from the unlawful distribution by a person less than 18 years of age of any substance or mixture that he or she knew or 22 23 reasonably should have known contained dangerous fentanyl or 24 fentanyl analogs when such substance or mixture is proven to 25 have caused, or is proven to have been a substantial factor in
