A bill to be entitled

An act relating to student mental health; amending s. 1006.041, F.S.; requiring minimum ratios of school psychologists and of certified school counselors, school social workers, or other licensed mental health professionals to students in certain grades, respectively, beginning with a specified school year; making technical changes; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 1006.041, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1006.041 Mental health assistance program.—Each school district must implement a school-based mental health assistance program that includes training classroom teachers and other school staff in detecting and responding to mental health issues and connecting children, youth, and families who may experience behavioral health issues with appropriate services.

(2) A plan required under subsection (1) must be focused on a multitiered system of supports to deliver evidence-based mental health care assessment, diagnosis, intervention, treatment, and recovery services to students with one or more mental health or co-occurring substance abuse diagnoses and to students at high risk of such diagnoses. The provision of these services must be coordinated with a student's primary mental health care provider and with other mental health providers involved in the student's care. At a minimum, the plan must include all of the following components:

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(a) Direct employment of school-based mental health services providers to expand and enhance school-based student services and to increase reduce the ratio of staff to students to staff in order to better align with nationally recommended ratio models. The Providers must shall include, but need are not be limited to, certified school counselors, school psychologists, school social workers, and other licensed mental health professionals. However, by the beginning of the 2027 school year and each subsequent school year, the ratio of school psychologists must be at least 1 per 700 full-time students in grades 9 through 12 and the ratio of certified school counselors, school social workers, or other licensed mental health professionals must be 1 per 250 full-time students in grades 9 through 12. The plan must also identify strategies to increase the amount of time that school-based student services personnel spend providing direct services to students, which may include the review and revision of district staffing resource allocations based on school or student mental health assistance needs.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
