20	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

22	Section 1. Effective January 1, 2026, section 429.177,
23	Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
24	429.177 Patients with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or
25	other <u>memory</u> <del>related</del> disorders; certain disclosures <u>; minimum</u>
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26 standards.-27 "Memory care services" means specialized or focused (1)28 care and services designed to address health or behavioral 29 issues resulting from Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or other 30 memory disorders. (2) (a) A facility that advertises itself as a memory care 31 32 provider or otherwise claims that the facility provides memory 33 care services, including, but not limited to, services for 34 residents with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or other memory disorders, must meet all of the following standards of operation 35 36 for such services: 37 1. Develop and implement policies and procedures 38 addressing all of the following: 39 a. Admittance criteria. b. Care and services necessary to address the needs of 40 41 persons admitted for memory care services. 42 2. Activities specifically designed and offered for 43 persons admitted for memory care services. 44 3. Maintenance of a current and accurate log of residents 45 admitted as receiving memory care services. 46 (b) The standards in paragraph (a) apply to any unit 47 designated for the provision of memory care services or to a 48 facility that provides memory care services to any resident 49 admitted and requiring such services.

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50 In addition to the requirements of s. 429.24, resident (3) 51 contracts must specify all memory care services to be provided 52 and any related costs should those costs exceed standard room 53 and board. 54 (4) In addition to the requirements of s. 429.26(7), for 55 persons residing in a memory care facility, the facility shall: 56 (a) Notify a licensed physician when a resident has a 57 change of condition specific to increased or more severe dementia, or other memory disorder to ensure that appropriate 58 59 care is provided to the resident. The notification must occur within 30 days after the acknowledgement of such changes in 60 61 condition by facility staff. If a change in the resident's condition is determined 62 (b) 63 to exist, notify the resident's representative or designee and 64 assist in making appointments for the necessary care and 65 services for treatment of the change in condition. 66 If the resident does not have a representative or (C) 67 designee, or if the resident's representative or designee cannot 68 be located or is unresponsive, arrange with the appropriate 69 health care provider for the necessary care and services for treatment of the change in condition. 70 71 The memory care facility, or if a memory care (5)(a) 72 provider has a specific unit designated for memory care 73 services, must have at least one staff member present to provide 74 care and services at all times. The staff member shall:

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75 1. Stay awake at all times. 76 2. Meet any training required as defined by statute or 77 rule for assisted living facilities, including the training and 78 continuing education requirements of s. 430.5025. 79 3. Be certified in first aid and cardiopulmonary 80 resuscitation. 81 (b) A staff member administering medication or providing 82 assistance with the self-administration of medication may not be 83 considered as the sole staff member toward the staffing 84 requirement while engaged in these tasks. (6) A facility licensed under this part which claims that 85 86 it provides special care for persons who have Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or other memory related disorders must 87 88 disclose in its advertisements or in a separate document those 89 services that distinguish the care as being especially 90 applicable to, or suitable for, such persons. The facility must 91 give a copy of all such advertisements or a copy of the document 92 to each person who requests information about programs and 93 services for persons with Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or 94 other memory related disorders offered by the facility and must 95 maintain a copy of all such advertisements and documents in its records. The agency shall examine all such advertisements and 96 documents in the facility's records as part of the license 97 renewal procedure. 98 99 Section 2. Effective January 1, 2026, section 429.178,

103	430.71 Florida Alzheimer's Center of Excellence
104	(1) PURPOSE AND INTENT The purpose of this section is to
105	assist and support persons with Alzheimer's disease or related
106	forms of dementia and their caregivers by connecting them with
107	resources in their communities to address two primary goals:
108	(a) To allow residents of this state living with
109	Alzheimer's disease or related forms of dementia to age in
110	place.
111	(b) To empower family caregivers to improve their own
112	well-being.
113	(2) DEFINITIONSAs used in this section, the term:
114	(a) "Center" means the Florida Alzheimer's Center for
115	Excellence.
116	(b) "Department" means the Department of Elderly Affairs.
117	(3) POWERS AND DUTIES
118	(a) There is created within the department the Florida
119	Alzheimer's Center of Excellence, which shall assist in
120	improving the quality of care for persons living with
121	Alzheimer's disease or related forms of dementia and improved
122	quality of life for family caregivers. The center may contract
123	for services necessary to implement this section. The center
124	shall:
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1. Conduct caregiver assessments to measure caregiver 125 126 burden. 127 2. Create personalized plans that guide caregivers to 128 community resources, empowering them with the skills, education, 129 support, and planning necessary for effective caregiving, including addressing any medical, emotional, social, legal or 130 131 financial challenges experienced by the person with Alzheimer's 132 disease or a related form of dementia. 133 3. Educate and assist caregivers with strategies for 134 caregiving for someone with Alzheimer's disease or a related form of dementia and provide guidance on all aspects of home-135 136 based care, including home safety, physical and mental health, legal and financial preparedness, communication skills, and 137 138 hands-on care techniques. 139 4. Provide online educational resources for caregivers. 140 5. Track outcomes, including, but not limited to, 141 decreased hospitalizations, reduced emergency department visits, 142 reduction in falls, and reduction in caregiver burnout. 143 6. By December 1 of each year, submit a report to the 144 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report must address the number of 145 families served, the types of services provided, and the 146 147 outcomes achieved. The center shall work with the Area Agencies on Aging; 148 (b) the Alzheimer's Disease Advisory Committee established under s. 149

151	ss. 430.501-430.504; the state-funded memory disorder clinics
152	established under s. 430.502; the department's Dementia Care and
153	Cure Initiative task forces; universities; hospitals; and other
154	available community resources to ensure full use of the state's
155	infrastructure.
156	(4) ELIGIBILITY FOR SERVICES.—
157	(a) To qualify for assistance from the center, an
158	individual or caregiver must meet all of the following criteria:
159	1. At least one person in the household is a caregiver for
160	a person diagnosed with, or suspected to have, Alzheimer's
161	disease or a related form of dementia.
162	2. The caregiver or the person diagnosed with, or
163	suspected to have, Alzheimer's disease or a related form of
164	dementia, is a resident of this state.
165	3. The person seeking assistance has the goal of providing
166	in-home care for the person diagnosed with, or suspected to
167	have, Alzheimer's disease or a related form of dementia.
168	(b) If the person seeking assistance meets the criteria in
169	paragraph (a), the center may provide assistance to the
170	caregiving family, subject to the availability of funds and
171	resources.
172	Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this
173	act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
