Such management practices must require prescription 16 drugs to be subject to formulary inclusion or exclusion but may 17 not restrict access to the most clinically appropriate, clinically effective, and lowest net-cost prescription drugs and 18 19 supplies. Drugs excluded from the formulary must be available for inclusion if a physician, advanced practice registered 20 nurse, or physician assistant prescribing a pharmaceutical 21 clearly states on the prescription that the excluded drug is 22 23 medically necessary. Prescription drugs and supplies first made 24 available in the marketplace after January 1, 2020, may not be 25 covered by the prescription drug program until specifically 26 included in the list of covered prescription drugs and supplies. 27 2. No later than September 1, 2025, the department must 28 submit to the Governor and the Legislative Budget Commission 29 recommendations on the implementation of formulary management

The list 70 of prescription drugs and supplies that will be excluded from 71 program coverage must be approved by the Legislative Budget 72 Commission. If the department proposes to exclude prescription 73 drugs and supplies after the plan year has commenced, the 74 department must provide notice to the Governor, the President of 75 the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of 76 such exclusions at least 60 days before implementation of such 77 exclusions. Such exclusions must be approved by the Legislative 78 Budget Commission.

Effective January 1, 2026, and contingent upon the Legislative Budget Commission approving one or more recommendations of the Department of Management Services under sub-subparagraph (a)2.a. of subsection (9) of section 110.12315, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 1 of this act, paragraph (a) of subsection (9) of section 110.12315, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 1 of this act, is amended to read:

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86 110.12315 Prescription drug program.—The state employees' 87 prescription drug program is established. This program shall be 88 administered by the Department of Management Services, according 89 to the terms and conditions of the plan as established by the 90 relevant provisions of the annual General Appropriations Act and 91 implementing legislation, subject to the following conditions:
