14	purposes; requiring the list of prescription drugs and
15	supplies excluded from the state employees'
16	prescription drug program to be approved by the
17	commission; removing the requirement that certain
18	drugs excluded from the formulary be available for
19	inclusion under specified circumstances; removing
20	certain changes made by the act under specified
21	circumstances; requiring the commission to notify the
22	Division of Law Revision of the commission's approval
23	of certain recommendations; providing effective dates.

25	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

27	Section 1. Subsection (9) of section 110.12315, Florida
28	Statutes, is amended to read:
29	110.12315 Prescription drug programThe state employees'
30	prescription drug program is established. This program shall be
31	administered by the Department of Management Services, according
32	to the terms and conditions of the plan as established by the
33	relevant provisions of the annual General Appropriations Act and
34	implementing legislation, subject to the following conditions:
35	(9)(a) 1 . Beginning with the 2020 plan year, the department
36	must implement formulary management for prescription drugs and
37	supplies. Such management practices must require prescription
38	drugs to be subject to formulary inclusion or exclusion but may
39	not restrict access to the most clinically appropriate,
40	clinically effective, and lowest net-cost prescription drugs and
41	supplies. Drugs excluded from the formulary must be available
42	for inclusion if a physician, advanced practice registered
43	nurse, or physician assistant prescribing a pharmaceutical
44	clearly states on the prescription that the excluded drug is
45	medically necessary. Prescription drugs and supplies first made
46	available in the marketplace after January 1, 2020, may not be
47	covered by the prescription drug program until specifically
48	included in the list of covered prescription drugs and supplies.
49	2. No later than September 1, 2025, the department must
50	submit to the Governor and the Legislative Budget Commission

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51	recommendations on the implementation of formulary management
52	for prescription drugs and supplies for the 2026 plan year,
53	including, but not limited to, recommendations relating to the
54	following:
55	a. Lists of excluded prescription drugs and supplies for a
56	recommended formulary, with a comparison to the formulary in
57	effect during the 2025 plan year. A recommended formulary is not
58	subject to the requirement in subparagraph 1. that drugs
59	excluded from the formulary must be available for inclusion if a
60	physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or physician
61	assistant prescribing a pharmaceutical clearly states on the
62	prescription that the excluded drug is medically necessary.
63	b. Lists of included prescription drugs and supplies for a
64	recommended formulary, with a comparison to the formulary in
65	effect during the 2025 plan year.
66	c. Prior authorization of specified prescription drugs and
67	supplies.
68	d. Step therapy of specified prescription drugs and
69	supplies.
70	3. Prescription drugs and supplies first made available in
71	the marketplace after January 1, 2026, may not be covered by the
72	prescription drug program until specifically included in the
73	list of covered prescription drugs and supplies.
74	4. In support of its recommendations, the department must
75	submit relevant information identifying the prescription drugs

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76	and supplies affected, the number of plan members and
77	prescriptions affected for each identified drug or supply, and
78	the cost savings expected for each recommended component
79	implemented.
80	5. The Legislative Budget Commission may consider the
81	department's recommendations in total or in part, and, beginning
82	in the 2026 plan year, the department shall implement only those
83	recommendations approved by the Legislative Budget Commission.
84	(b) No later than <u>September</u> October 1, <u>2025</u> 2019 , and by
85	each <u>September</u> October 1 thereafter, the department must submit
86	to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of
87	the House of Representatives the list of prescription drugs and
88	supplies that will be excluded from program coverage for the
89	next plan year and, for informational purposes only, the list of
90	prescription drugs and supplies that are recommended to be
91	subject to a higher copayment for the next plan year. The list
92	of prescription drugs and supplies that will be excluded from
93	program coverage must be approved by the Legislative Budget
94	Commission. If the department proposes to exclude prescription
95	drugs and supplies after the plan year has commenced, the
96	department must provide notice to the Governor, the President of
97	the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of
98	such exclusions at least 60 days before implementation of such
99	exclusions. Such exclusions must be approved by the Legislative
100	Budget Commission.
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Section 2. Effective January 1, 2026, and contingent upon 101 102 the Legislative Budget Commission approving one or more 103 recommendations of the Department of Management Services under 104 sub-subparagraph (a)2.a. of subsection (9) of section 110.12315, 105 Florida Statutes, as amended by section 1 of this act, paragraph (a) of subsection (9) of section 110.12315, Florida Statutes, as 106 107 amended by section 1 of this act, is amended to read: 108 110.12315 Prescription drug program.-The state employees' 109 prescription drug program is established. This program shall be 110 administered by the Department of Management Services, according to the terms and conditions of the plan as established by the 111 112 relevant provisions of the annual General Appropriations Act and implementing legislation, subject to the following conditions: 113 114 (9) (a) 1. Beginning with the 2026 2020 plan year, the 115 department must implement formulary management for prescription drugs and supplies. 168	amended by section 1 of this act.
169	Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this
170	act, this act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
