Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Section 106.146, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 106.146 Requirements for political polls.-
- (1) As used in this section, the term "political poll" means a sampling or collection of responses to questions on a political subject which are taken from a selected or random group of persons or voters for the purpose of analysis.
- (2) A political poll conducted within this state, regardless of whether such poll is conducted by telephone call, text message, or e-mail, must contain the phrase "Sponsored and paid for by," followed by the name of the persons or organizations sponsoring and paying for the political poll. If the political poll is conducted by:
- (a) A telephone call, the phrase must be provided at the beginning of the call.
- (b) A text message, the text message must include the phrase at the beginning of the text message.
 - (c) An e-mail, the e-mail must include the phrase in bold

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type with a font size of at least 12 points.

- (3) (a) A person who willfully violates subsection (2) commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
- (b) For purposes of paragraph (a), the term "person" includes any individual or organization conducting a political poll; any candidate, any officer of any political committee, affiliated party committee, or political party executive committee; any officer, partner, attorney, or other representative of a corporation, partnership, or other business entity; and any agent or other person acting on behalf of any candidate, political committee, affiliated party committee, political party executive committee, or corporation, partnership, or other business entity.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
