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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to criminal offenses; amending s. 784.048, F.S.; revising the definitions of the terms "harass," "course of conduct," and "cyberstalk"; providing criminal penalties for persons who willfully or maliciously harass or cyberstalk specified justice system personnel; revising the elements of an offense constituting aggravated stalking; amending s. 901.02, F.S.; authorizing courts to issue a warrant for a defendant's arrest under specified circumstances; making technical changes; amending ss. 921.0022, 948.06, and 948.062, F.S.; conforming crossreferences; reenacting s. 784.0493(1), F.S., relating to harassment or intimidation based on religious or ethnic heritage, to incorporate the amendment made to s. 784.048, F.S., in a reference thereto; reenacting and amending s. 1006.147, F.S.; conforming a crossreference; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Present subsections (5) through (9) of section 784.048, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as subsections (6) through (10), respectively, a new subsection (5) is added to that section, and subsection (1) and present subsection (7) of that section, are amended, to read:

784.048 Stalking; definitions; penalties.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (d) (a) "Harass" means to engage in a course of conduct,

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directly or through a third party, directed at a specific person which causes substantial emotional distress to that person and serves no legitimate purpose.

(a) (b) "Course of conduct" means a pattern of conduct composed of a series of acts over a period of time, however short, which evidences a continuity of purpose. The term includes acts done through a third party or by using a camera, drone, or other means to observe or spy upon a victim. The term does not include constitutionally protected activity such as picketing or other organized protests.

(b) (c) "Credible threat" means a verbal or nonverbal threat, or a combination of the two, including threats delivered by electronic communication or implied by a pattern of conduct, which places the person who is the target of the threat in reasonable fear for his or her safety or the safety of his or her family members or individuals closely associated with the person, and which is made with the apparent ability to carry out the threat to cause such harm. It is not necessary to prove that the person making the threat had the intent to actually carry out the threat. The present incarceration of the person making the threat is not a bar to prosecution under this section.

(c) (d) "Cyberstalk" means:

- 1. To engage in a course of conduct to communicate, or to cause to be communicated, directly or indirectly, words, images, or language by or through the use of electronic mail or electronic communication, directed at or pertaining to a specific person; or
- 2. To access, or attempt to access, the online accounts or Internet-connected home electronic systems of another person

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without that person's <u>prior written</u> permission <u>and without that</u> permission being withdrawn,

causing substantial emotional distress to that person and serving no legitimate purpose.

- (5) A person who willfully or maliciously harasses or cyberstalks justice system personnel specified in s. 775.0823, which offense arises out of or is within the scope of the official duties of such justice system personnel, commits the offense of aggravated stalking, a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (8) (7) A person who, after having been sentenced for a violation of s. 794.011, s. 800.04, or s. 847.0135(5) and prohibited from contacting the victim of the offense under s. 921.244, willfully or, maliciously, and repeatedly follows, harasses, or cyberstalks the victim commits the offense of aggravated stalking, a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 2. Section 901.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 901.02 Issuance of arrest warrants.-
- (1) As used in this section, the term "electronic signature" has the same meaning as in s. 933.40.
- (2) A judge, upon examination of the complaint and proofs submitted, if satisfied that probable cause exists for the issuance of an arrest warrant for any crime committed within the judge's jurisdiction, shall thereupon issue an arrest warrant signed by the judge with the judge's name of office.
 - (3) $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ The court may issue a warrant for the defendant's

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arrest if when all of the following circumstances apply:

- (a) A complaint has been filed charging $\underline{\text{only}}$ the commission of a misdemeanor $\underline{\text{only}}$.
- (b) The summons issued to the defendant has been returned unserved.
 - (c) The conditions of subsection (2) $\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ are met.
- (4) (3) The court may issue a warrant for the defendant's arrest if all of the following criteria apply:
- (a) A complaint has been filed charging only the commission of a misdemeanor.
- (b) The alleged crime involves driving under the influence as described in s. 316.193, assault as defined in s. 784.011, battery as described in s. 784.03, or stalking as described in s. 784.048, or there is reason to believe that the defendant poses a danger to a victim or the public.
 - (c) The conditions of subsection (2) are met.
- (5) A judge may electronically sign an arrest warrant if the requirements of subsection (1) or subsection (2), subsection (3), or subsection (4) are met and if the judge, based on an examination of the complaint and proofs submitted, determines that the complaint meets all of the following criteria:
- (a) It bears the affiant's signature or, if the complaint was submitted electronically, the affiant's electronic signature if the complaint was submitted electronically.
- (b) $\underline{\text{It}}$ is supported by an oath or affirmation administered by the judge or other person authorized by law to administer oaths.
- (c) If submitted electronically, $\underline{\text{it}}$ is submitted by reliable electronic means.
