A bill to be entitled

An act relating to chemical additives in food products; creating s. 500.454, F.S.; beginning on a specified date, prohibiting a food establishment from manufacturing, selling, or distributing food that contains specified chemical additives; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Section 500.454, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 500.454 Prohibited chemical additives; penalties.-
- (1) Beginning January 1, 2028, a food establishment may not manufacture, sell, or distribute a food that contains any of the following chemical additives:
 - (a) Brominated vegetable oil.
 - (b) Potassium bromate.
 - (c) Propylparaben.
 - (d) Red dye 3.
 - (e) Blue dye 1.
 - (f) Yellow dye 5.
 - (g) Benzidine.
 - (h) Butylated hydroxyanisole.
 - (i) Butylated hydroxytoluene.
- (2) A food establishment that violates subsection (1) is subject to an administrative fine in the Class II category pursuant to s. 570.971 for a first violation. For a second or subsequent violation of subsection (1), such establishment is
