9	a. "Authorized he	alth care practitioner" means a physician
10	licensed under chapter	458 or chapter 459, a physician assistant

13	b. "Participating	school" means a public school which
14	maintains a supply of u	ndesignated glucagon pursuant to this
15	paragraph.	
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16 <u>c. "Undesignated glucagon" means a glucagon rescue therapy</u> 17 <u>approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration that</u> 18 <u>does not require reconstitution for the treatment of severe</u> 19 <u>hypoglycemia in a dosage form that can be rapidly administered</u> 20 <u>to the patient in an emergency, including prefilled injectable</u> 21 <u>or nasally administered glucagon, and is prescribed in the name</u> 22 of a public school pursuant to this paragraph.

23 2. A school district may not restrict the assignment of a student who has diabetes to a particular school on the basis 24 that the student has diabetes, that the school does not have a 25 full-time school nurse, or that the school does not have trained 26 27 diabetes personnel. Diabetic students whose parent and physician provide their written authorization to the school principal may 28 29 carry diabetic supplies and equipment on their person and attend 30 to the management and care of their diabetes while in school, participating in school-sponsored activities, or in transit to 31 32 or from school or school-sponsored activities to the extent 33 authorized by the parent and physician and within the parameters 34 set forth by State Board of Education rule. The written 35 authorization shall identify the diabetic supplies and equipment 36 that the student is authorized to carry and shall describe the activities the child is capable of performing without 37 assistance, such as performing blood-glucose level checks and 38 urine ketone testing, administering insulin through the insulin-39

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40 delivery system used by the student, and treating hypoglycemia41 and hyperglycemia.

42 The State Board of Education, in cooperation with the a. Department of Health, shall adopt rules to encourage every 43 44 school in which a student with diabetes is enrolled to have personnel trained in routine and emergency diabetes care. The 45 46 State Board of Education, in cooperation with the Department of 47 Health, shall also adopt rules for the management and care of diabetes by students in schools that include provisions to 48 49 protect the safety of all students from the misuse or abuse of diabetic supplies or equipment. 50

51 <u>b.</u> A school district, county health department, and 52 public-private partner, and the employees and volunteers of 53 those entities, shall be indemnified by the parent of a student 54 authorized to carry diabetic supplies or equipment for any and 55 all liability with respect to the student's use of such supplies 56 and equipment pursuant to this paragraph.

57 3. A public school may acquire and maintain a supply of 58 undesignated glucagon for the purpose of treating a student 59 experiencing a hypoglycemic emergency. Undesignated glucagon 60 must be stored in a secure location on the school's premises that is immediately accessible to a school nurse or other school 61 62 personnel trained to administer glucagon pursuant to this 63 paragraph.
