An act relating to artificial food dyes in K-12 schools; providing legislative findings; creating s. 595.411, F.S.; prohibiting the use of specified dyes in foods for certain K-12 food programs; amending s. 1001.42, F.S.; requiring district school boards to adopt a policy prohibiting the use of specified food dyes in foods for certain food programs and vending machines; providing exemptions from such prohibition; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that synthetic food dyes have been linked to behavioral problems in children, potentially leading to diminished learning environments in schools, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature further finds that parents lose control over their children's nutrition once their children enter school, having access to food dyes that may not be available at home, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 595.411, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

595.411 Artificial dye prohibited.—Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any foods served in a program or the school breakfast program may not contain the following:
