Remove lines 52-156 and insert:

(A) Compare services administered through each managing entity, the outcomes of each managing entity's expenditures, each managing entity's expenditures for behavioral health services, and any other information as determined by the department.

(B) Analyze services funded by each managing entity rendered to individuals who are also Medicaid beneficiaries to, at a minimum, assess the extent to which managing entities are funding services that are also available as covered services under the Medicaid program.

17 b. Recommendations to improve transparency of system
18 performance, including, but not limited to, metrics and criteria
19 used to measure each managing entity's performance and patient
20 and system outcomes, and the format and method to be used to
21 collect and report necessary data and information.

22 2. Prepare a report of the information gathered in
23 subparagraph 1. and present the final report on or before
24 December 1, 2025, to the Governor, the President of the Senate,
25 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

26 (5) MANAGING ENTITY DUTIES.—A managing entity shall:

27 (v) Report all required data to the department in a
28 standardized electronic format to ensure interoperability and to
29 facilitate data analysis. The submission format must meet all of
30 the following criteria:

31 1. Payments to providers for services, reported in a
32 format that reflects the client, service provided, date of
33 service, place of service, diagnosis if available, and other
34 information typically reported in a standardized format for
35 electronic data interchange that is used for health care claims
36 processing.

37 2. Information must be organized into discrete, machine-
38 readable data elements that allow for efficient processing and
39 integration with other datasets.

40 3. All data fields must comply with established protocols
41 as specified by the department.

42 4. The standardized format must be compatible with
43 automated systems to enable the downloading, parsing, and
44 combining of data with other sources for analysis.

45 5. Submissions must pass validation checks to confirm
46 adherence to the required data structure and format before the
47 submission is accepted.

48 (w) Submit to the department all documents that are
49 required under contract for submission on a routine basis in an
50 electronic format that allows for accurate text recognition and
51 data extraction as specified by the department, which may
52 include, but is not limited to, Portable Document Format or
53 machine-readable text files. The documents must be accompanied
54 by metadata containing key information that ensures proper
55 organization, processing, and integration into the department's
56 systems. The required metadata must include, but is not limited
57 to, all of the following elements:

58 1. A descriptive and unique name for the document,
59 following any naming conventions prescribed by the department.

60 2. The date the document is uploaded.

61 3. A predefined classification indicating the nature or
62 category of the document.

63 4. Any relevant identifiers, such as application numbers,
64 case numbers, or tracking codes, as specified by the department.

65 5. The name, contact information, and any other required
66 identification number, which may include, but is not limited to,

67 a contract, license, or registration number, of the person or
68 organization submitting the document.

69 6. Any other metadata fields as prescribed by the
70 department to facilitate accurate processing and analysis.

71 (7) PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY.—

72 (a) Managing entities shall collect and submit data to the
73 department regarding persons served, outcomes of persons served,
74 costs of services provided through the department's contract,
75 and other data as required by the department. The department
76 shall evaluate managing entity performance and the overall
77 progress made by the managing entity, together with other
78 systems, in meeting the community's behavioral health needs,
79 based on consumer-centered outcome measures that reflect
80 national standards, if possible, that can be accurately
81 measured. The department shall work with managing entities to
82 establish performance standards, including, but not limited to:

83 1.~~(a)~~ The extent to which individuals in the community
84 receive services, including, but not limited to, parents or
85 caregivers involved in the child welfare system who need
86 behavioral health services.

87 2.~~(b)~~ The improvement in the overall behavioral health of
88 a community.

89 3.~~(c)~~ The improvement in functioning or progress in the
90 recovery of individuals served by the managing entity, as

determined using person-centered measures tailored to the population.

~~4.(d)~~ The success of strategies to:

~~a.1.~~ Divert admissions from acute levels of care, jails, prisons, and forensic facilities as measured by, at a minimum, the total number and percentage of clients who, during a specified period, experience multiple admissions to acute levels of care, jails, prisons, or forensic facilities;

~~b.2.~~ Integrate behavioral health services with the child welfare system; and

~~c.3.~~ Address the housing needs of individuals being released from public receiving facilities who are homeless.

~~5.(e)~~ Consumer and family satisfaction.

~~6.(f)~~ The level of engagement of key community constituencies, such as law enforcement agencies, community-based care lead agencies, juvenile justice agencies, the courts, school districts, local government entities, hospitals, and other organizations, as appropriate, for the geographical service area of the managing entity.

(b) Managing entities must submit specific measures to the department regarding individual outcomes and system functioning, which the department must post to, and maintain on, its website by the 22nd of every month or if the 22nd day occurs on a weekend or a holiday under s.110.117(1)(a)-(i), the report must be posted before the conclusion of the next business day.
