11	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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13	Section 1. Section 500.181, Florida Statutes, is created
14	to read:
15	500.181 Food additives
16	(1)(a) Effective July 1, 2026, an article used for food or
17	drink for human consumption containing any synthetic color
18	additive, including Blue 1 (CAS 3844-45-9), Blue 2 (CAS 860-22-
19	0), Green 3 (CAS 2353-45-9), Red 40 (CAS 25956-17-6), Yellow 5
20	(CAS 1934-21-0), Yellow 6 (CAS 2783-94-0), and, when used as a
21	color additive, titanium dioxide (CAS 13463-67-7), must display
22	the following warning:

24	"WARNING: This product contains synthetic colors, which may have
25	an adverse effect on activity and attention in children."
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CODING: Words stricken are deletions; words underlined are additions.

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26	(b) A manufacturer may, until December 31, 2028, use an
27	adhesive sticker to provide the warning requirements in
28	paragraph (a). However, beginning January 1, 2029, such warnings
29	must be printed directly on the product's packaging.
30	(2)(a) A manufacturer who violates subsection (1) is
31	subject to a formal written notice and a fine of:
32	1. Up to \$1,000 per item, for a first offense.
33	2. Up to \$2,500 per item, for a second offense.
34	3. Up to \$5,000 per item, for a third or subsequent
35	offense.
36	(b) A retailer or distributor who sells a product that
37	violates subsection (1) is subject to the following penalties:
38	1. A written warning for a first offense.
39	2. A formal citation requiring corrective action for a
40	second offense.
41	3. A fine of \$750 for a third offense.
42	4. A fine of \$1,000 for a fourth offense.
43	5. A fine of up to \$2,500 for a fifth or subsequent
44	offense.
45	(c) Fines collected pursuant to this section shall be
46	deposited in the department's General Inspection Trust Fund.
47	(3) The department shall conduct inspections under this
48	section as part of regular food and drink product inspections.
49	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
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
