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10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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12	Section 1. Subsection (13) is added to section 403.814,
13	Florida Statutes, to read:
14	403.814 General permits; delegation
15	(13) (a) As used in this subsection, the term:
16	1. "Distributed wastewater treatment system" means a
17	category of domestic wastewater facility consisting of one or
18	more distributed wastewater treatment units.
19	2. "Distributed wastewater treatment unit" means an
20	advanced onsite closed-tank wastewater treatment system that is:
21	a. Designed to achieve secondary treatment standards and a
22	minimum of 80 percent total nitrogen removal before discharge to
23	a subsurface application system; and
24	b. Remotely operated and controlled by the permittee using
25	an electronic control system.

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26 A general permit is granted for the replacement of (b) 27 septic systems subject to s. 381.0065 that have a distributed 28 wastewater treatment system which is commonly owned and operated 29 by the permittee in accordance with this subsection. The 30 installation of a distributed wastewater treatment unit under 31 the permit may proceed without any further agency action by the 32 department if, at least 30 days before installation of the 33 distributed wastewater treatment unit, a notification certifying that the unit was designed by a professional registered in this 34 35 state in accordance with rules adopted under this chapter and 36 will meet all of the following requirements: 37 The design capacity of the distributed wastewater 1. 38 treatment unit will not exceed 10,000 gallons per day of 39 domestic wastewater or 5,000 gallons per day of commercial 40 wastewater. 41 2. The distributed wastewater treatment unit may discharge 42 without disinfection into a slow-rate subsurface application 43 system that is designed and operated to protect public health 44 and safety and meets the current separation from, and at all 45 times has a minimum of 12 inches of separation from, the 46 seasonal high groundwater. 47 3. Horizontal setback distances from the distributed 48 wastewater treatment unit and subsurface application system to property lines, surface waterbodies, potable water wells, and 49 50 utilities are consistent with rules adopted under s. 381.0065

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51 and this chapter. 52 (c) A permittee under this subsection must: 53 1. Have legal access to maintain, operate, and, in the 54 case of termination of service, remove the distributed 55 wastewater treatment unit. 56 2. Submit a plan for conducting monthly effluent 57 compliance sampling of a representative number of deployed 58 distributed wastewater treatment units, the results of which may 59 be aggregated to determine compliance with performance standards 60 consistent with this subsection and rules adopted under this 61 chapter. 62 3. Conduct monthly reporting, annual inspections, recordkeeping, and biosolids management consistent with rules 63 64 adopted under this chapter. 65 4. Have staffing and visitation by licensed operators in a 66 manner that is consistent with rules adopted under this chapter, 67 except that visitation may be accomplished using an electronic control system. 68 69 The operation of any distributed wastewater treatment (d) 70 unit installed under the general permit may not: 71 1. Create saturated conditions on the ground surface; 72 2. Adversely impact wetlands or other surface waters; or 73 3.
