21	(b) An advanced practice registered nurse who is certified
22	as a registered nurse anesthetist licensed under part I of
23	chapter 464 shall administer anesthesia under the onsite medical
24	direction of a professional licensed under chapter 458, chapter
25	459, or chapter 466, and in accordance with an established
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26 protocol approved by the medical staff. The medical direction 27 shall specifically address the needs of the individual patient. 28 This paragraph does not apply to an autonomous advanced practice 29 registered nurse registered under s. 464.0123 who is certified 30 as a registered nurse anesthetist licensed under part I of chapter 464; however, a facility may require a certified 31 32 registered nurse anesthetist who is registered and practicing 33 under s. 464.0123 to perform acts under an established protocol 34 approved by the medical staff or the governing board of the 35 facility. 36 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 37 464.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 464.012 Licensure of advanced practice registered nurses; 38 39 fees; controlled substance prescribing.-In addition to the general functions specified in 40 (4) 41 subsection (3), an advanced practice registered nurse may 42 perform the following acts within his or her specialty: 43 A The certified registered nurse anesthetist may, to (b) the extent authorized by an established protocol approved by the 44 45 medical staff of the facility in which the anesthetic service is 46 performed, or a certified registered nurse anesthetist that is registered and practicing under s. 464.0123 without an 47 established protocol, may perform any or all of the following: 48 49 1. Determine the health status of the patient as it 50 relates to the risk factors and to the anesthetic management of

72	pertinent to the anesthetic health care management of the

74	6. Support life functions during anesthesia health care,
75	including induction and intubation procedures, the use of

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76 appropriate mechanical supportive devices, and the management of 77 fluid, electrolyte, and blood component balances. 78 7. Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, 79 80 or other forms of therapy. Recognize and treat a cardiac arrhythmia while the 81 8. 82 patient is under anesthetic care. 83 Participate in management of the patient while in the 9. postanesthesia recovery area, including ordering the 84 85 administration of fluids and drugs. 10. For certified nurse midwives, engage in autonomous 102 103 practice in the performance of the acts listed in s. 104 464.012(4)(c). 105 3. Perform the general functions of an advanced practice registered nurse under s. 464.012(3) related to primary care. 106 107 4. For certified registered nurse anesthetists registered and practicing under this section, perform the acts listed in s. 108 109 464.012(4)(b). 110 5.4. For a patient who requires the services of a health care facility, as defined in s. 408.032(8): 111 112 Admit the patient to the facility. a. 113 b. Manage the care received by the patient in the 114 facility. 115 c. Discharge the patient from the facility, unless prohibited by federal law or rule. 116 117 6.5. Provide a signature, certification, stamp, 118 verification, affidavit, or endorsement that is otherwise 119 required by law to be provided by a physician, except an 120 advanced practice registered nurse registered under this section 121 may not issue a physician certification under s. 381.986. 122 Section 4.
