14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

16	Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 770.02, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:
18	770.02 Correction, apology, or retraction by newspaper or
19	broadcast station
20	(1) If it appears upon the trial that said article or
21	broadcast was published in good faith; that its falsity was due
22	to an honest mistake of the facts; that there were reasonable
23	grounds for believing that the statements in said article or
24	broadcast were true; and that, within the period of time
25	specified in subsection (2), a full and fair correction,
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26 apology, or retraction was, in the case of a newspaper or 27 periodical, published in the same editions or corresponding 28 issues of the newspaper or periodical in which said article appeared and in as conspicuous place and type as said original 29 30 article or, in the case of a broadcast, the correction, apology, 31 or retraction was broadcast at a comparable time, then the 32 plaintiff in such case shall recover only actual damages. For 33 purposes of this section, if such an article or broadcast has been published on the Internet, the article or broadcast must be 34 35 permanently removed from the Internet within the time period 36 provided in paragraph (2)(a) in order to limit recovery to 37 actual damages as provided in this section.

38 Section 2. Section 770.04, Florida Statutes, is amended to 39 read:

40 770.04 Civil liability of <u>certain media outlets</u> <del>radio or</del> 41 <del>television broadcasting stations;</del> care to prevent publication or 42 utterance required.-

43 The owner, licensee, or operator of a radio or (1) 44 television broadcasting station or newspaper, and the agents or employees of any such owner, licensee, or operator, shall not be 45 46 liable for any damages for any defamatory statement published or 47 uttered in or as a part of a radio or television broadcast or 48 newspaper article, by one other than such owner, licensee, or 49 operator, or general agent or employees thereof, unless it shall 50 be alleged and proved by the complaining party $_{\tau}$  that such owner,

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51 licensee, operator, general agent, or employee, has failed to 52 exercise due care to prevent the publication or utterance of 53 such statement in such <u>broadcast or article</u> <del>broadcasts</del>, 54 provided, however, the exercise of due care shall be construed 55 to include the bona fide compliance with any federal law or the 56 regulation of any federal regulatory agency.

57 (2) When an owner, a licensee, or an operator described in 58 subsection (1) publishes a defamatory statement on the Internet 59 with no knowledge of falsity of the statement and thereafter 60 receives notice that such statement has been found in a judicial proceeding to be false, or receives notice of facts that would 61 62 cause a reasonable person to conclude that such statement was false, and the owner, licensee, or operator fails to take 63 64 reasonable steps to permanently remove the statement and any 65 related report from the Internet, the continued appearance of 66 such statement or report on the Internet after the notice shall 67 be a new publication for purpose of the statute of limitations, and the owner, licensee, or operator shall not be entitled to a 68 69 fair reporting privilege for such new publication; provided that 70 no action shall be commenced more than 20 years after the date 71 of first publication. 72 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
