26 licensed to carry more than 10 customers, wherein a fee is paid, 27 either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of taking or 28 attempting to take saltwater <u>or freshwater</u> fish, is \$800 per 29 year. The license must be kept aboard the vessel at all times.

30 (c)1. A license for any person who operates any vessel 31 licensed to carry no more than 10 customers, or for any person 32 licensed to operate any vessel carrying 6 or fewer customers, 33 wherein a fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, for the 34 purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater <u>or freshwater</u> 35 fish, is \$400 per year.

36 2. A license for any person licensed to operate any vessel 37 carrying 6 or fewer customers but who operates a vessel carrying 38 4 or fewer customers, wherein a fee is paid, either directly or 39 indirectly, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take 40 saltwater <u>or freshwater</u> fish, is \$200 per year. The license must 41 be kept aboard the vessel at all times.

A person who operates a vessel required to be licensed pursuant to paragraph (b) or this paragraph may obtain a license in her or his own name, and such license shall be transferable and apply to any vessel operated by the purchaser, provided that the purchaser has paid the appropriate license fee.

(d) A license for a recreational vessel not for hire and
for which no fee is paid, either directly or indirectly, by
guests for the purpose of taking or attempting to take saltwater
<u>or freshwater</u> fish noncommercially is \$2,000 per year. The

51 license may be purchased at the option of the vessel owner and 52 must be kept aboard the vessel at all times. A log of species 53 taken and the date the species were taken shall be maintained 54 and a copy of the log filed with the commission at the time of 55 renewal of the license.

(e) The owner, operator, or custodian of a vessel the operator of which has been licensed pursuant to paragraph (a) must maintain and report such statistical data as required by, and in a manner set forth in, the rules of the commission.

If the operator of a vessel that carries scuba divers 60 (f) 61 for a fee, either directly or indirectly, maintains the 62 appropriate vessel license under this subsection based upon the 63 number of persons the vessel is licensed to carry and the applicable permits, the individual scuba divers engaging in 64 taking or attempting to take saltwater or freshwater products 65 are not required to obtain individual fishing licenses or any 66 applicable permits. However, if the operator of such a vessel 67 68 does not have the appropriate license and applicable permits, 69 the individual scuba divers engaging in taking or attempting to 70 take saltwater or freshwater products must have individual 71 fishing licenses and any applicable permits.

78 (b) The presumption that tangible personal property used in another state, territory of the United States, or the 79 80 District of Columbia for 6 months or longer before being 81 imported into this state was not purchased for use in this state 82 does not apply to any boat for which a saltwater or freshwater 83 fishing license fee is required to be paid pursuant to s. 379.354(7), either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of 84 85 taking, attempting to take, or possessing any saltwater or freshwater fish for noncommercial purposes. Use tax shall apply 86 87 and be due on such a boat as provided in this paragraph, and 88 proof of payment of such tax must be presented before prior to 89 the first such licensure of the boat, registration of the boat 90 pursuant to chapter 328, and titling of the boat pursuant to chapter 328. A boat that is first licensed within 1 year after 91 92 purchase shall be subject to use tax on the full amount of the 93 purchase price; a boat that is first licensed in the second year 94 after purchase shall be subject to use tax on 90 percent of the 95 purchase price; a boat that is first licensed in the third year 96 after purchase shall be subject to use tax on 80 percent of the purchase price; a boat that is first licensed in the fourth year 97 98 after purchase shall be subject to use tax on 70 percent of the purchase price; a boat that is first licensed in the fifth year 99 after purchase shall be subject to use tax on 60 percent of the 100

101 purchase price; and a boat that is first licensed in the sixth 102 year after purchase, or later, shall be subject to use tax on 50 103 percent of the purchase price. If the purchaser fails to provide 104 the purchase invoice on such boat, the fair market value of the 105 boat at the time of importation into this state shall be used to 106 compute the tax.

107Section 3. Paragraphs (i) and (j) of subsection (2) of108section 379.353, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
