### Effect of the Bill:

The bill changes the name of the Division of Investigative and Forensic Services to “Division of Criminal Investigations” anywhere it appears in the Florida Statutes to conform to the requirements of s. 63 of Ch. 2024-140, Laws of Florida.

## ANALYSIS

### EFFECT OF THE BILL:

Replaces the use of or reference to the term “Division of Investigative and Forensic Services” with “Division of Criminal Investigations”. (Sections 1-28).

The bill becomes effective 60 days after adjournment sine die. (Section 29).

## RELEVANT INFORMATION

### SUBJECT OVERVIEW:

During the 2024 Legislative Session, the Legislature passed CS/CS/CS/HB 989, which directed the Division of Law Revision to prepare a reviser’s bill to change the name of the “Division of Investigative and Forensic Services”, within the Department of Financial Services, to “Division of Criminal Investigations.”

This reviser’s bill complies with that directive, changing the name anywhere that it appears in the Florida Statutes.
