The bill changes the name of the Division of Investigative and Forensic Services to "Division of Criminal Investigations" anywhere it appears in the Florida Statutes to conform to the requirements of s. 63 of Ch. 2024-140, Laws of Florida.

EFFECT OF THE BILL:

<u>HB 7021</u> passed as <u>SB 38.</u> (Please note that bill section parentheticals do not contain hyperlinks to bill sections for Senate bills)

Replaces the term "Division of Investigative and Forensic Services" with "Division of Criminal Investigations". (Sections 1-28).

The bill becomes effective 60 days after adjournment sine die. (Section 29).

The bill was approved by the Governor on April 10, 2025, ch. 2025-4, L.O.F., and becomes effective on the 60^{th} day following adjournment sine die.

RELEVANT INFORMATION

SUBJECT OVERVIEW:

During the 2024 Legislative Session, the Legislature passed <u>CS/CS/HB 989</u>, which directed the Division of Law Revision to prepare a reviser's bill to change the name of the "Division of Investigative and Forensic Services", within the Department of Financial Services, to "Division of Criminal Investigations."

This reviser's bill complies with that directive, changing the name anywhere it appears in the Florida Statutes.
