5.a. For students in grades 6 through 12, the social, 61 62 emotional, and physical effects of social media. 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Health education and life skills instruction and materials may 76 77 not contradict the principles enumerated in subsection (3). 78 79 The State Board of Education is encouraged to adopt standards 80 and pursue assessment of the requirements of this subsection. 81 Instructional programming that incorporates the values of the 82 recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor and that is offered as part of a social studies, English Language Arts, or 83 other schoolwide character building and veteran awareness 84 85 initiative meets the requirements of paragraph (u). Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
