 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

9 **Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 390.0111, Florida**
 10 **Statutes, is amended to read:**

11 390.0111 Termination of pregnancies.—

12 (1) TERMINATION DURING VIABILITY ~~AFTER GESTATIONAL AGE OF~~
 13 ~~6 WEEKS; WHEN ALLOWED.—~~A physician may only ~~not~~ knowingly
 14 perform or induce a termination of pregnancy that is determined
 15 viable as provided in s. 390.01112 ~~if the physician determines~~
 16 ~~the gestational age of the fetus is more than 6 weeks unless one~~
 17 ~~of the following conditions is met:~~

18 ~~(a) Two physicians certify in writing that, in reasonable~~
 19 ~~medical judgment, the termination of the pregnancy is necessary~~
 20 ~~to save the pregnant woman's life or avert a serious risk of~~
 21 ~~substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a major~~
 22 ~~bodily function of the pregnant woman other than a psychological~~
 23 ~~condition.~~

24 ~~(b) The physician certifies in writing that, in reasonable~~
 25 ~~medical judgment, there is a medical necessity for legitimate~~

26 ~~emergency medical procedures for termination of the pregnancy to~~
27 ~~save the pregnant woman's life or avert a serious risk of~~
28 ~~imminent substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a~~
29 ~~major bodily function of the pregnant woman other than a~~
30 ~~psychological condition, and another physician is not available~~
31 ~~for consultation.~~

32 ~~(c) The pregnancy has not progressed to the third~~
33 ~~trimester and two physicians certify in writing that, in~~
34 ~~reasonable medical judgment, the fetus has a fatal fetal~~
35 ~~abnormality.~~

36 ~~(d) The pregnancy is the result of rape, incest, or human~~
37 ~~trafficking and the gestational age of the fetus is not more~~
38 ~~than 15 weeks as determined by the physician. At the time the~~
39 ~~woman schedules or arrives for her appointment to obtain the~~
40 ~~abortion, she must provide a copy of a restraining order, police~~
41 ~~report, medical record, or other court order or documentation~~
42 ~~providing evidence that she is obtaining the termination of~~
43 ~~pregnancy because she is a victim of rape, incest, or human~~
44 ~~trafficking. If the woman is 18 years of age or older, the~~
45 ~~physician must report any known or suspected human trafficking~~
46 ~~to a local law enforcement agency. If the woman is a minor, the~~
47 ~~physician must report the incident of rape, incest, or human~~
48 ~~trafficking to the central abuse hotline as required by s.~~

52 390.01112 Termination of pregnancies during viability.—

53 (1) A ~~No~~ termination of pregnancy may not ~~shall~~ be
54 performed on any human being if the physician determines that,
55 in reasonable medical judgment, the fetus has achieved
56 viability, unless:

57 (a) Two physicians certify in writing that, in reasonable
58 medical judgment, the termination of the pregnancy is necessary:

59 1. To save the pregnant woman's life or avert a serious
60 risk of substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a
61 major bodily function of the pregnant woman other than a
62 psychological condition; or

63 2. Because the fetus has a fatal fetal abnormality.

64 (b) The physician certifies in writing that, in reasonable
65 medical judgment, there is a medical necessity for legitimate
66 emergency medical procedures for termination of the pregnancy to
67 save the pregnant woman's life or avert a serious risk of
68 imminent substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a
69 major bodily function of the pregnant woman other than a
70 psychological condition, and another physician is not available
71 for consultation.
