## House Resolution

A resolution recognizing September 15 to October 15, 2025, as "Latin and Hispanic Heritage Month" in Florida.

WHEREAS, the national, month-long celebration known as "Hispanic Heritage Month" is dedicated to the culture, history, and contributions of Latin American and Hispanic countries, and

WHEREAS, the celebration begins on September 15 to coincide with the national independence days of Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, and Costa Rica, and

WHEREAS, the national, month-long celebration includes festivals, art shows, conferences, and community gatherings across the United States, and

WHEREAS, Hispanic and Latino Floridians are the secondlargest racial and ethnic group in this state, making up 27.4 percent of the population, and

WHEREAS, Hispanic and Latino Floridians contribute approximately \$90 billion to this state's economy in labor and entrepreneurship, and have a spending power of approximately \$66.4 billion, and

WHEREAS, there are many influential Hispanic and Latino
Americans, including civil rights activist and co-founder of the
National Farm Workers Association, Caesar Chavez; the first
Hispanic-American woman to travel to space and be inducted into

the United States Astronaut Hall of Fame, Ellen Ochoa; and the first Hispanic-American woman to serve as a member of the United States Supreme Court, Justice Sonia Sotomayor, and

WHEREAS, Hispanic and Latino Americans have made a lasting impact in Florida socially, culturally, and economically, including traveling to space; being elected to public offices such as Mayor, Lieutenant Governor, and Congress; and becoming prominent singers, film stars, and athletes, and

WHEREAS, Hispanic and Latin heritage is an integral part of United States and Florida history, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That September 15 to October 15, 2025, is recognized as "Latin and Hispanic Heritage Month" in Florida to acknowledge and celebrate all of the contributions of Hispanic and Latin Floridians.
