1 House Resolution 2 A resolution designating September 2025 as "Childhood 3 Cancer Awareness Month" in Florida. 4 5 WHEREAS, almost 15,000 children are diagnosed with cancer 6 in the United States each year, and 7 WHEREAS, childhood cancer occurs regularly and randomly and 8 does not distinguish between ethnic groups, socioeconomic class, 9 or geographic regions, and 10 WHEREAS, approximately 9,600 children are diagnosed aged 0-14 and 5,300 adolescents aged 15-19 as of 2024, and there are 11 12 roughly 500,000 survivors of childhood and adolescent cancer in 13 the United States, and 14 WHEREAS, each year, many children in Florida face a cancer 15 diagnosis which impacts parents, grandparents, loved ones, 16 friends, neighbors, and communities, and 17 WHEREAS, many infants, children, and teens suffer from the 18 long-term effects of comprehensive treatment, including 19 secondary cancers, and as many as two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will experience late effects of chemotherapy or 20 21 radiation, which may persist or develop five years after diagnosis, and 22 23 WHEREAS, although the incidence of childhood cancer has 24 been rising slightly in recent decades, survival rates continue 25 to improve as a result of improved treatment options, and

27	cancer is higher than 80 percent; however, survival rates may
28	vary based on the type of cancer and the age of the patient, and
29	WHEREAS, Childhood Cancer Awareness Month serves as a
30	valuable opportunity to raise awareness of childhood cancer,
31	including the late effects of cancer treatment on childhood
32	cancer survivors and the need for early detection, immediate
33	care, and advanced research, and
34	WHEREAS, many health care professionals, researchers,
35	private philanthropies, and social support organizations are
36	dedicated to helping children and their families by offering
37	social, emotional, spiritual, educational, and financial
38	support, and these groups and institutions are committed to
39	generating a greater understanding of childhood cancer and
