1012.56 Educator certification requirements.-

31 (1) APPLICATION.-Each person seeking certification 32 pursuant to this chapter shall submit a completed application 33 containing the applicant's social security number to the 34 Department of Education and remit the fee required pursuant to s. 1012.59 and rules of the State Board of Education. Pursuant 35 36 to the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996, each party is required to provide 37 his or her social security number in accordance with this 38 596263

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39 section. Disclosure of social security numbers obtained through 40 this requirement is limited to the purpose of administration of 41 the Title IV-D program of the Social Security Act for child 42 support enforcement.

43 (b) The department shall issue a temporary certificate to a qualifying applicant within 14 calendar days after receipt of 44 45 a request from an employer with a professional education competence demonstration program pursuant to paragraph (6)(f) 46 and subsection (9). The temporary certificate must cover the 47 48 classification, level, and area for which the applicant is 49 deemed qualified. The department shall electronically notify the 50 applicant's employer that the temporary certificate has been 51 issued and provide the applicant an official statement of status 52 of eligibility at the time the certificate is issued.

The statement of status of eligibility must be provided 54 55 electronically and must advise the applicant of any 56 qualifications that must be completed to qualify for 57 certification. Each method by which an applicant can complete 58 the qualifications for a professional certificate must be included in the statement of status of eligibility. Each 59 statement of status of eligibility is valid for 5 years after 60 61 its date of issuance, except as provided in paragraph (2)(d).

62 (2) ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA.—To be eligible to seek63 certification, a person must:

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64 Submit to background screening in accordance with (d) subsection (9) (11). If the background screening indicates a 65 66 criminal history or if the applicant acknowledges a criminal 67 history, the applicant's records shall be referred to the 68 investigative section in the Department of Education for review 69 and determination of eligibility for certification. If the 70 applicant fails to provide the necessary documentation requested 71 by the department within 90 days after the date of the receipt 72 of the certified mail request, the statement of eligibility and 73 pending application shall become invalid.

74 (3) MASTERY OF GENERAL KNOWLEDGE.—Acceptable means of75 demonstrating mastery of general knowledge are:

76 Achievement of passing scores, identified in state (e) 77 board rule, on national or international examinations that test 78 comparable content and relevant standards in verbal, analytical 79 writing, and quantitative reasoning skills, including, but not 80 limited to, the verbal, analytical writing, and quantitative 81 reasoning portions of the Graduate Record Examination and the 82 SAT, ACT, and Classic Learning Test. Passing scores identified 83 in state board rule must be at approximately the same level of 84 rigor as is required to pass the general knowledge examinations; 85 or

86 (f) Documentation of receipt of a master's or higher 87 degree from an accredited postsecondary educational institution 88 that the Department of Education has identified as having a 596263

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89	quality program resulting in a baccalaureate degree or higher <u>;</u>

91	(g) Successful completion of an introduction to education
92	course and a classroom management and high-impact teaching
93	strategies course approved pursuant to s. 1012.551.

95	A school district that employs an individual who does not
96	achieve passing scores on any subtest of the general knowledge
97	examination must provide information regarding the availability
98	of state-level and district-level supports and instruction to
99	assist him or her in achieving a passing score. Such information
100	must include, but need not be limited to, state-level test
101	information guides, school district test preparation resources,
102	and preparation courses offered by state universities and
103	Florida College System institutions. The requirement of mastery
104	of general knowledge shall be waived for an individual who has
105	been provided 3 years of supports and instruction and who has
106	been rated effective or highly effective under s. 1012.34 for

 For a professional certificate covering grades 6
 through 12:

167 a. Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2)(a)-168 (h).

b. Holds a master's or higher degree in the area ofscience, technology, engineering, or mathematics.

171 c. Teaches a high school course in the subject of the172 advanced degree.

d. Is rated highly effective as determined by the
teacher's performance evaluation under s. 1012.34, based in part
on student performance as measured by a statewide, standardized

e. Achieves a passing score on the Florida professionaleducation competency examination required by state board rule.

3. Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2) (a)(h) and completes a <u>Coaching for Educator Readiness and Teaching</u>
<u>Certification Program pursuant to s. 1012.551</u> professional
learning certification program approved by the department
pursuant to paragraph (8) (c) or an educator preparation
institute approved by the department pursuant to s. 1004.85. An
applicant who completes one of these programs and is rated
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188 highly effective as determined by his or her performance 189 evaluation under s. 1012.34 is not required to take or achieve a 190 passing score on the professional education competency 191 examination in order to be awarded a professional certificate.

(b) The department shall issue a temporary certificate toany applicant who:

(e) A person who is issued a temporary certificate under
paragraph (b) must be assigned a teacher mentor <u>or clinical</u>
<u>educator</u> for a minimum of 2 school years after commencing
employment. Each teacher mentor <u>or clinical educator</u> selected by
the school district, charter school, or charter management
organization must:

Hold a valid professional certificate issued pursuant

249	set to expire, the department shall electronically notify the

253	(8) PROFESSIONAL LEARNING CERTIFICATION PROGRAM
254	(a) The Department of Education shall develop and each
255	school district, charter school, and charter management
256	organization may provide a cohesive competency-based
257	professional learning certification program by which
258	instructional staff may satisfy the mastery of professional
259	preparation and education competence requirements specified in
260	subsection (6) and rules of the State Board of Education.
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261	Participants must hold a state-issued temporary certificate. A
262	school district, charter school, or charter management
263	organization that implements the program shall provide a
264	competency-based certification program developed by the
265	Department of Education or developed by the district, charter
266	school, or charter management organization and approved by the
267	Department of Education. These entities may collaborate with
268	other supporting agencies or educational entities for
269	implementation. The program shall include the following:
270	1. A teacher mentorship and induction component.

280	(IV) Must have earned an effective or highly effective
281	rating on the prior year's performance evaluation; and
282	(V) May be a peer evaluator under the district's
283	evaluation system approved under s. 1012.34.
284	b. The teacher mentorship and induction component must, at
285	a minimum, provide routine opportunities for mentoring and
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286	induction activities, including ongoing professional learning as
287	described in s. 1012.98 targeted to a teacher's needs,
288	opportunities for a teacher to observe other teachers, co-
289	teaching experiences, and reflection and followup discussions.
290	Professional learning must meet the criteria established in s.
291	1012.98(3). Mentorship and induction activities must be provided
292	for an applicant's first year in the program and may be provided
293	until the applicant attains his or her professional certificate
294	in accordance with this section.
295	2. An assessment of teaching performance aligned to the
296	district's, charter school's, or charter management
297	organization's system for personnel evaluation under s. 1012.34
298	which provides for:
299	a. An initial evaluation of each educator's competencies
300	to determine an appropriate individualized professional learning
301	plan.
302	b. A summative evaluation to assure successful completion
303	of the program.
304	3. Professional education preparation content knowledge,
305	which must be included in the mentoring and induction activities
306	under subparagraph 1., that includes, but is not limited to, the
307	following:
308	a. The state academic standards provided under s. 1003.41,
309	including scientifically researched and evidence-based reading
310	instructional strategies grounded in the science of reading,
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311	content literacy, and mathematical practices, for each subject
312	identified on the temporary certificate. Reading instructional
313	strategies for foundational skills shall include phonics
314	instruction for decoding and encoding as the primary
315	instructional strategy for word reading. Instructional
316	strategies may not employ the three-cueing system model of
317	reading or visual memory as a basis for teaching word reading.
318	Instructional strategies may include visual information and
319	strategies which improve background and experiential knowledge,
320	add context, and increase oral language and vocabulary to
321	support comprehension, but may not be used to teach word
322	reading.
323	b. The educator-accomplished practices approved by the
324	state board.
325	4. Required achievement of passing scores on the subject
326	area and professional education competency examination required
327	by State Board of Education rule. Mastery of general knowledge
328	must be demonstrated as described in subsection (3).
329	5. Beginning with candidates entering a program in the
330	2022-2023 school year, a candidate for certification in a
331	coverage area identified pursuant to s. 1012.585(3)(f) must
332	successfully complete all competencies for a reading
333	endorsement, including completion of the endorsement practicum.
334	(b) Professional learning certification program courses:

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335	1. May not distort significant historical events or
336	include curriculum or instruction that teaches identity
337	politics, violates s. 1000.05, or is based on theories that
338	systemic racism, sexism, oppression, and privilege are inherent
339	in the institutions of the United States and were created to
340	maintain social, political, and economic inequities.
341	2. Must afford candidates the opportunity to think
342	critically, achieve mastery of academic program content, learn
343	instructional strategies, and demonstrate competence.
344	(c) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the
345	approval and continued approval of professional learning
346	certification programs aligned to paragraph (a). A teacher may
347	not satisfy requirements for a professional certificate through
348	a professional learning certification program unless the program
349	has been approved by the department pursuant to this paragraph.
350	(9) PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION COMPETENCY PROGRAM
351	(a) Each school district must and a private school or
352	state-supported public school, including a charter school, may
353	develop and maintain a system by which members of the
354	instructional staff may demonstrate mastery of professional
355	preparation and education competence as required by law. Each
356	program must be based on classroom application of the Florida
357	Educator Accomplished Practices and instructional performance
358	and, for public schools, must be aligned with the district's or

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359	state-supported public school's evaluation system established
360	under s. 1012.34, as applicable.
361	(b) The Commissioner of Education shall determine the
362	continued approval of programs implemented under this paragraph,
363	based upon the department's review of performance data. The
364	department shall review the performance data as a part of the
365	periodic review of each school district's professional learning
366	system required under s. 1012.98.

368	1012.585, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

Each district school board shall include in its inservice 399 master plan the ability for teachers to receive inservice points 400 for supporting students in extracurricular career and technical 401 education activities, such as career and technical student 402 organization activities outside of regular school hours and 403 training related to supervising students participating in a 404 career and technical student organization. Credits or points 405 earned through approved summer institutes may be applied toward the fulfillment of these requirements. Inservice points may also 406 be earned by participation in professional growth components 407 approved by the State Board of Education and specified pursuant 408 596263

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409 to s. 1012.98 in the district's approved master plan for 410 inservice educational training; however, such points may not be 411 used to satisfy the specialization requirements of this 412 paragraph.

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the area of scientifically researched, knowledge-based reading 434 435 literacy grounded in the science of reading, including explicit, 436 systematic, and sequential approaches to reading instruction, 437 developing phonemic awareness, and implementing multisensory 438 intervention strategies, and computational skills acquisition, exceptional student education, normal child development, and the 439 440 disorders of development may be applied toward any 441 specialization area. Credits or points that provide training in 442 the areas of drug abuse, child abuse and neglect, strategies in teaching students having limited proficiency in English, or 443 444 dropout prevention, or training in areas identified in the 445 educational goals and performance standards adopted pursuant to ss. 1000.03(5) and 1008.345 may be applied toward any 446 447 specialization area, except specialization areas identified by 448 State Board of Education rule that include reading instruction 449 or intervention for any students in kindergarten through grade 450 6. Each district school board shall include in its inservice 451 master plan the ability for teachers to receive inservice points 452 for supporting students in extracurricular career and technical 453 education activities, such as career and technical student 454 organization activities outside of regular school hours and 455 training related to supervising students participating in a career and technical student organization. Credits or points 456 earned through approved summer institutes may be applied toward 457 458 the fulfillment of these requirements. Inservice points may also 596263

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459 be earned by participation in professional growth components 460 approved by the State Board of Education and specified pursuant 461 to s. 1012.98 in the district's approved master plan for 462 inservice educational training; however, such points may not be 463 used to satisfy the specialization requirements of this 464 paragraph.

465 2. For an applicant whose professional certificate has 466 been expired for less than 2 years, any college credits or 467 inservice points previously accrued but not used toward the 468 recertification of his or her professional certificate may be 469 applied toward the recertification of such certificate.

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
