39	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

41	Section 1. Section 1002.37, Florida Statutes, is amended
42	to read:
43	1002.37 The Florida Virtual School
44	(1)(a) The Florida Virtual School is established for the
45	development and delivery of online and distance learning
46	education. The Commissioner of Education shall monitor the
47	school's performance and report its performance to the State
48	Board of Education and the Legislature.
49	(b) The mission of the Florida Virtual School is to
50	provide students with technology-based educational opportunities
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51 to gain the knowledge and skills necessary to succeed. The 52 school shall serve <u>all students</u> any student in the state who 53 <u>meet meets</u> the profile for success in this educational delivery 54 context. and shall give priority to:

55 1. Students who need expanded access to courses in order 56 to meet their educational goals, such as home education students 57 and students in inner-city and rural high schools who do not 58 have access to higher-level courses.

59 2. Students seeking accelerated access in order to obtain
60 a high school diploma at least one semester early.

3. Students who are children of an active duty member of
the United States Armed Forces who is not stationed in this
state whose home of record or state of legal residence is
Florida.

(c) To ensure <u>parents and</u> students are informed of the opportunities offered by the Florida Virtual School, the commissioner shall provide the board of trustees of the Florida Virtual School access to the records of public school students in a format prescribed by the board of trustees.

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The board of trustees of the Florida Virtual School shall identify appropriate performance measures and standards based on student achievement that reflect the school's statutory mission and priorities, and shall implement an accountability system for the school that includes assessment of its effectiveness and

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76 efficiency in providing quality services that encourage high 77 student achievement, seamless articulation, and maximum access.

78 (2) The Florida Virtual School shall be governed by a 79 board of trustees comprised of seven members appointed by the 80 Governor to 4-year staggered terms. The board of trustees shall be a public agency entitled to sovereign immunity pursuant to s. 81 82 768.28, and board members shall be public officers who shall 83 bear fiduciary responsibility for the Florida Virtual School. The board of trustees shall have the following powers and 84 85 duties:

86 (a)1. The board of trustees shall meet at least 4 times
87 each year, upon the call of the <u>board</u> chair, or at the request
88 of a majority of the <u>board</u> membership, or at the request of the
89 <u>Florida Virtual School president and chief executive officer</u>.

90 2. The fiscal year for the Florida Virtual School shall be91 the state fiscal year as provided in s. 216.011(1)(q).

92 (b) The board of trustees shall be responsible for the 93 Florida Virtual School's development of a state-of-the-art 94 technology-based education delivery system that is cost-95 effective, educationally sound, marketable, and capable of 96 sustaining a self-sufficient delivery system through the Florida 97 Education Finance Program <u>and other supplemental funding</u> 98 <u>sources</u>.

99 (c) The board of trustees shall aggressively seek avenues100 to generate revenue to support its future endeavors, and shall

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101 enter into agreements with distance learning providers. The 102 board of trustees may acquire, enjoy, use, and dispose of 103 patents, copyrights, and trademarks and any licenses and other rights or interests thereunder or therein. Ownership of all such 104 patents, copyrights, trademarks, licenses, and rights or 105 interests thereunder or therein shall vest in the state, with 106 107 the board of trustees having full right of use and full right to 108 retain the revenues derived therefrom. Any funds realized from patents, copyrights, trademarks, or licenses shall be considered 109 110 internal funds as provided in s. 1011.07. Such funds shall be 111 used to support the school's mission and its marketing, and 112 research, and development activities in order to improve 113 courseware and services to its students.

(d) The board of trustees shall be responsible for the administration and control of all local school funds derived from all activities or sources and shall prescribe the principles and <u>policies</u> procedures to be followed in administering these funds.

(e) The Florida Virtual School may accrue supplemental revenue from <u>direct-support organizations and</u> supplemental support organizations, which include, but are not limited to, alumni associations, foundations, parent-teacher associations, and booster associations. The governing body of each <u>direct-</u> <u>support organization and</u> supplemental support organization shall recommend the expenditure of moneys collected by the

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126 organization for the benefit of the school. Such expenditures 127 shall be contingent upon the review <u>and approval</u> of the <u>Florida</u> 128 <u>Virtual School president and chief</u> executive <u>officer or an</u> 129 <u>authorized designee</u> director. The executive director may 130 override any proposed expenditure of the organization that would 131 violate Florida law or breach sound educational management.

(f) In accordance with law and rules of the State Board of Education, the board of trustees shall administer and maintain personnel programs for all employees of the board of trustees and the Florida Virtual School. The board of trustees may adopt rules, policies, and procedures related to the appointment, employment, and removal of personnel.

The board of trustees shall determine the compensation,
 including salaries and fringe benefits, and other conditions of
 employment for such personnel.

The board of trustees may establish and maintain a 141 2. 142 personnel loan or exchange program by which persons employed by 143 the board of trustees for the Florida Virtual School as academic 144 administrative and instructional staff may be loaned to, or 145 exchanged with persons employed in like capacities by, public 146 agencies either within or without this state, or by private industry. With respect to public agency employees, the program 147 148 authorized by this subparagraph shall be consistent with the requirements of part II of chapter 112. The salary and benefits 149 of board of trustees personnel participating in the loan or 150

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151 exchange program shall be continued during the period of time 152 they participate in a loan or exchange program, and such 153 personnel shall be deemed to have no break in creditable or 154 continuous service or employment during such time. The salary 155 and benefits of persons participating in the personnel loan or exchange program who are employed by public agencies or private 156 157 industry shall be paid by the originating employers of those 158 participants, and such personnel shall be deemed to have no 159 break in creditable or continuous service or employment during 160 such time.

3. The employment of all Florida Virtual School academic 161 162 administrative personnel as defined in s. 1012.01(3) and instructional personnel as defined in s. 1012.01(2) shall be 163 164 subject to rejection for cause by the board of trustees, and 165 shall be subject to policies of the board of trustees relative 166 to certification, tenure, leaves of absence, sabbaticals, 167 remuneration, and such other conditions of employment as the 168 board of trustees deems necessary and proper, not inconsistent 169 with law.

4. Each person employed by the board of trustees in an
academic administrative or instructional capacity with the
Florida Virtual School shall be entitled to a contract as
provided by policies rules of the board of trustees.

1745. All employees except temporary, seasonal, and student175employees shall may be state employees for the purpose of being

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eligible to participate in the Florida Retirement System and receive benefits. The classification and pay plan, including terminal leave and other benefits, and any amendments thereto, shall be subject to review and approval by the Department of Management Services and the Executive Office of the Governor before prior to adoption.

182 (g) The board of trustees shall establish priorities for 183 admission of students in accordance with paragraph (1)(b).

184 <u>(g) (h)</u> The board of trustees shall establish and 185 distribute to all school districts and high schools in the state 186 procedures for enrollment of students in courses offered by the 187 Florida Virtual School.

188 (h) (h) (i) The board of trustees shall establish criteria 189 defining the elements of an approved franchise. The board of 190 trustees may enter into contracts and franchise agreements with 191 Florida district school boards and other educational 192 institutions and governmental agencies and may establish the 193 terms and conditions governing such contracts and agreements. 194 The board of trustees shall establish the performance and 195 accountability measures and report the performance of each 196 school district franchise to the Commissioner of Education.

197 <u>(i)(j)</u> The board of trustees shall submit to the State 198 Board of Education both forecasted and actual enrollments and 199 credit completions for the Florida Virtual School, according to 200 procedures established by the State Board of Education. At a

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201 minimum, such procedures must include the number of public, 202 private, and home education students served by program and by 203 county of residence.

204 <u>(j) (k)</u> The board of trustees shall provide for the content 205 and custody of student and employee personnel records. Student 206 records shall be subject to the provisions of s. 1002.22. 207 Employee records shall be subject to the provisions of s. 208 1012.31.

209 <u>(k)(1)</u> The financial records and accounts of the Florida 210 Virtual School shall be maintained under the direction of the 211 board of trustees and under rules adopted by the State Board of 212 Education for the uniform system of financial records and 213 accounts for the schools of the state.

215 The Governor shall designate the initial chair of the board of 216 trustees to serve a term of 4 years. Members of the board of 217 trustees shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed 218 for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061. The board of trustees shall be a body corporate with all the powers 219 220 of a body corporate and such authority as is needed for the 221 proper operation and improvement of the Florida Virtual School. 222 The board of trustees is specifically authorized to adopt rules, 223 policies, and procedures, consistent with law and rules of the 224 State Board of Education related to governance, personnel, 225 budget and finance, administration, programs, curriculum and

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instruction, travel and purchasing, technology, students, contracts and grants, and property as necessary for optimal, efficient operation of the Florida Virtual School. Tangible personal property owned by the board of trustees shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 273.

(3) Funding for the Florida Virtual School shall be provided as follows:

(a)1. The calculation of "full-time equivalent student" shall be as prescribed in s. 1011.61(1)(c)1.b.(V) and is subject to s. 1011.61(4).

236 2. For a student in a home education program, funding 237 shall be provided in accordance with this subsection upon course 238 completion if the parent verifies, upon enrollment for each 239 course, that the student is registered with the school district 240 as a home education student pursuant to s. 1002.41(1)(a).

(b) Full-time equivalent student credit completed through the Florida Virtual School, including credits completed during the summer, shall be reported to the Department of Education in the manner prescribed by the department and shall be funded through the Florida Education Finance Program.

(c) School districts may not limit student access tocourses offered through the Florida Virtual School.

(d) Full-time equivalent student credit completion for
courses offered through the Florida Virtual School shall be
reported only by the Florida Virtual School. School districts

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251 shall report full-time equivalent student membership only for 252 courses for which the district provides the instruction. Courses 253 delivered by the Florida Virtual School on a public school 254 campus shall be reported only by the school district in which 255 the student is enrolled.

(e) The comparable wage factor as provided in s.1011.62(2) shall be established as 1.000.

258 (f) The Florida Virtual School shall receive state funds 259 for operating purposes as provided in the General Appropriations 260 Act. The calculation to determine the amount of state funds 261 includes: the sum of the basic amount for current operations 262 established in s. 1011.62(1)(s), the discretionary millage 263 compression supplement established in s. 1011.62(5), the state-264 funded discretionary contribution established in s. 1011.62(6), 265 a per-full-time equivalent share of the exceptional student 266 education guaranteed allocation established in s. 1011.62(8), 267 the safe schools allocation established in s. 1011.62(12), and 268 the mental health assistance allocation established in s. 269 1011.62(13).

(g) In addition to the funds provided in the General
Appropriations Act, the Florida Virtual School may receive other
funds from grants and donations.

(4) School districts operating a virtual school that is an
approved franchise of the Florida Virtual School may count fulltime equivalent students, as provided in paragraph (3)(a), if

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such school has been certified as an approved franchise by the Commissioner of Education based on criteria established by the board of trustees pursuant to paragraph (2)(h) = (2)(i).

(5) Under no circumstance may the credit of the state bepledged on behalf of the Florida Virtual School.

281 The Florida Virtual School shall have an annual (6) 282 financial audit of its accounts and records conducted by an 283 independent auditor who is a certified public accountant 284 licensed under chapter 473. The independent auditor shall 285 conduct the audit in accordance with rules adopted by the 286 Auditor General pursuant to s. 11.45 and, upon completion of the 287 audit, shall prepare an audit report in accordance with such 288 rules. The audit report must include a written statement by the 289 board of trustees describing corrective action to be taken in 290 response to each of the independent auditor's recommendations 291 included in the audit report. The independent auditor shall submit the audit report to the board of trustees and the Auditor 292 293 General no later than 9 months after the end of the preceding 294 fiscal year.

(7) The board of trustees shall annually submit to the Governor, the Legislature, the Commissioner of Education, and the State Board of Education the audit report prepared pursuant to subsection (6) and a complete and detailed report setting forth:

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(a) the operations and accomplishments of the Florida

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301 Virtual School within the state and those occurring outside the state as Florida Virtual School Global. 302 303 (b) The marketing and operational plan for the Florida 304 Virtual School and Florida Virtual School Global, including 305 recommendations regarding methods for improving the delivery of 306 education through the Internet and other distance learning 307 technology. 308 (c) The assets and liabilities of the Florida Virtual School and Florida Virtual School Global at the end of the 309 310 fiscal year. 311 (d) Recommendations regarding the unit cost of providing 312 services to students through the Florida Virtual School and 313 Florida Virtual School Clobal. In order to most effectively 314 develop public policy regarding any future funding of the 315 Florida Virtual School, it is imperative that the cost of the program is accurately identified. The identified cost of the 316 317 program must be based on reliable data. 318 (c) Recommendations regarding an accountability mechanism 319 to assess the effectiveness of the services provided by the 320 Florida Virtual School and Florida Virtual School Global. 321 The State Board of Education may adopt rules it deems (8) 322 necessary to implement reporting requirements for the Florida Virtual School. 323 324 (9) (a) The Florida Virtual School may provide full-time 325 and part-time instruction for students in kindergarten through

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326 grade 12.

(b) For students receiving part-time <u>or full-time</u> instruction in kindergarten through grade <u>12</u> 5 and students receiving full-time instruction in kindergarten through grade <u>12</u> from the Florida Virtual School, the full-time equivalent student enrollment calculated under this subsection is subject to the requirements in s. 1011.61(4).

(10) (a) Public school students receiving full-time instruction in kindergarten through grade 12 by the Florida Virtual School must take all statewide assessments required pursuant to s. 1008.22 and participate in the coordinated screening and progress monitoring system under s. 1008.25(9).

(b) Public school students receiving part-time instruction by the Florida Virtual School in courses requiring statewide end-of-course assessments must take all statewide end-of-course assessments required pursuant to s. 1008.22.

342 (c) Industry certification examinations, national
343 assessments, and statewide assessments, and international
344 <u>assessments</u> offered by the school district shall be available to
345 all Florida Virtual School students.

(d) Unless an alternative testing site is mutually agreed
to by the Florida Virtual School and the school district or as
contracted under s. 1008.24, all industry certification
examinations, national assessments, progress monitoring under s.
1008.25(9), and statewide assessments, and international

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351 <u>assessments</u> must be taken at the school to which the student 352 would be assigned according to district school board attendance 353 areas. A school district must provide the student with access to 354 the school's testing facilities, a test administrator, and the 355 date and time of the administration of progress monitoring and 356 each examination or assessment.

(11) The Florida Virtual School shall receive a school grade pursuant to s. 1008.34 for students receiving full-time instruction.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
