14	Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section
15	1003.32, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
16	1003.32 Authority of teacher; responsibility for control
17	of students; district school board and principal dutiesSubject
18	to law and to the rules of the district school board, each
19	teacher or other member of the staff of any school shall have
20	such authority for the control and discipline of students as may
21	be assigned to him or her by the principal or the principal's
22	designated representative and shall keep good order in the
23	classroom and in other places in which he or she is assigned to
24	be in charge of students.
25	(1) In accordance with this section and within the

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26 framework of the district school board's code of student 27 conduct, teachers and other instructional personnel shall have 28 the authority to undertake any of the following actions in 29 managing student behavior and ensuring the safety of all 30 students in their classes and school and their opportunity to 31 learn in an orderly and disciplined classroom:

32 (a) Establish classroom rules of conduct, including
 33 designating an area for wireless communications devices during
 34 instructional time.

35 Section 2. Paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section
36 1006.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

37 1006.07 District school board duties relating to student 38 discipline and school safety.—The district school board shall 39 provide for the proper accounting for all students, for the 40 attendance and control of students at school, and for proper 41 attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the 42 welfare of students, including:

43 (2) CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT.-Adopt a code of student conduct for elementary schools and a code of student conduct for 44 middle and high schools and distribute the appropriate code to 45 all teachers, school personnel, students, and parents, at the 46 beginning of every school year. Each code shall be organized and 47 48 written in language that is understandable to students and parents and shall be discussed at the beginning of every school 49 year in student classes, school advisory council meetings, and 50

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51 parent and teacher association or organization meetings. Each 52 code shall be based on the rules governing student conduct and 53 discipline adopted by the district school board and shall be made available in the student handbook or similar publication. 54 55 Each code shall include, but is not limited to:

Notice that use of a wireless communications device 56 (f) 57 includes the possibility of the imposition of disciplinary 58 action by the school or criminal penalties if the device is used 59 in a criminal act. A student may possess a wireless 60 communications device while the student is on school property or in attendance at a school function; however, a student may not 61 62 use a wireless communications device during the school day 63 instructional time, except when expressly directed by a teacher 64 solely for educational purposes. A teacher shall designate an area for wireless communications devices during instructional 65 66 time. Each district school board shall adopt rules governing the use of a wireless communications device by a student while the 67 68 student is on school property or in attendance at a school 69 function, including rules:

70 1. Designating locations within school buildings where a 71 student may use his or her wireless communications device with the express permission of a school administrator. 72

73 2. Allowing the use of a wireless communications device by 74 a student during the school day in accordance with: The student's individualized education plan;

77	504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; or
78	c. A doctor's note from a physician licensed under chapter
79	458 or chapter 459 certifying in writing that the student
80	requires the use of a wireless communications device based upon
81	valid clinical reasoning or evidence.
82	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
