Section 5. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 320.0848, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

8 320.0848 Persons who have disabilities; issuance of 9 disabled parking permits; temporary permits; permits for certain 10 providers of transportation services to persons who have 11 disabilities.-

(1) (a) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or its authorized agents shall, upon application and receipt of the fee:

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Issue a disabled parking permit for a period of up to 4 15 1. years, which period ends on the applicant's birthday, to any 16 17 person who has long-term mobility impairment; 2. Issue, or a temporary disabled parking permit for up to 18 19 not to exceed 6 months to a any person who has a temporary 20 mobility impairment; or-21 3. Issue a lifetime disabled parking permit to a person 22 who is certified as permanently disabled due to permanent dismemberment or an amputation and is in need of the disabled 23 24 parking permit due to that permanent dismemberment or amputation. A lifetime disabled parking permit is valid from the 25 26 date of issuance until the person's death and is not subject to 27 renewal under paragraph (d). 28 29 A No person is not will be required to pay a fee for a parking permit for disabled persons more than once in a 12-month period 30 31 from the date of the prior fee payment. 32 (b)1. The person must be currently certified as being 33 legally blind or as having any of the following disabilities 34 that render him or her unable to walk 200 feet without stopping 35 to rest: Inability to walk without the use of or assistance from 36 a. 37 a brace, cane, crutch, prosthetic device, or other assistive device, or without the assistance of another person. c. Restriction by lung disease to the extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for 1 second, when measured by spirometry, is less than 1 liter, or the person's arterial oxygen is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at rest.

d. Use of portable oxygen.

e. Restriction by cardiac condition to the extent that the
person's functional limitations are classified in severity as
Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American
Heart Association.

54 f. Severe limitation in the person's ability to walk due 55 to an arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition.

56 2. The certification of disability which is required under 57 subparagraph 1. must be provided by a physician licensed under 58 chapter 458, chapter 459, or chapter 460, by a podiatric 59 physician licensed under chapter 461, by an optometrist licensed 60 under chapter 463, by an advanced practice registered nurse licensed under chapter 464 under the protocol of a licensed 61 62 physician as stated in this subparagraph, by a physician assistant licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459, or by a 63 similarly licensed physician from another state if the 64

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65 application is accompanied by documentation of the physician's 66 licensure in the other state and a form signed by the out-of-67 state physician verifying his or her knowledge of this state's 68 eligibility guidelines.

69 (c) The certificate of disability must include, but need 70 not be limited to:

1. The disability of the applicant; the certifying practitioner's name and address; the practitioner's certification number; the eligibility criteria for the permit; the penalty for falsification by either the certifying practitioner or the applicant; the duration of the condition that entitles the person to the permit; and justification for the additional placard pursuant to subsection (2).

103 (e) The Department of Highway safety and Motor vehicles 104 shall, in consultation with the Commission for the 105 Transportation Disadvantaged, adopt rules, in accordance with 106 chapter 120, for the issuance of a disabled parking permit to 107 any organization that can adequately demonstrate a bona fide 108 need for such a permit because the organization provides regular 109 transportation services to persons who have disabilities and are 110 certified as provided in this subsection.

111 (2) DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; PERSONS WITH LONG-TERM 112 MOBILITY PROBLEMS, PERMANENT DISMEMBERMENT, OR AMPUTATION.-113

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114 The disabled parking permit is a placard that can be (a) placed in a motor vehicle so as to be visible from the front and 115 116 rear of the vehicle. Each side of the placard must have the international symbol of accessibility in a contrasting color in 117 118 the center so as to be visible. One side of the placard must 119 display the applicant's driver license number or state 120 identification card number along with a warning that the 121 applicant must have such identification at all times while using 122 the parking permit. In those cases where the severity of the disability prevents a disabled person from physically visiting 123 124 or being transported to a driver license or tax collector office to obtain a driver license or identification card, a certifying 125 126 physician may sign the exemption section of the department's 127 parking permit application to exempt the disabled person from 128 being issued a driver license or identification card for the 129 number to be displayed on the parking permit. A validation 130 sticker must also be issued with each disabled parking permit, showing the month and year of expiration, or, in the case of a 131 lifetime disabled parking permit, indicating that the permit 132 133 does not expire, on each side of the placard. Validation 134 stickers must be of the size specified by the Department of 135 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and must be affixed to the disabled parking permits. The disabled parking permits must use 136 137 the same colors as license plate validations.

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(b) License plates issued under ss. 320.084, 320.0842,
320.0843, and 320.0845 are valid for the same parking privileges
and other privileges provided under ss. 316.1955, 316.1964, and
526.141(5)(a).

(c) The department shall not issue an additional disabled parking permit unless the applicant states that he or she is a frequent traveler or a quadriplegic. The department may not issue to any one eligible applicant more than two disabled parking permits except to an organization in accordance with paragraph (1) (e). Subsections (1), (5), (6), and (7) apply to this subsection.
