A bill to be entitled

An act relating to county constitutional officers; amending s. 100.041, F.S.; revising when the term of office for certain elected offices commences; authorizing certain officers-elect to have access to specified facilities; defining the term "access to all facilities"; amending s. 129.06 and 195.087, F.S.; revising when specified officers must abide by certain limitations related to approved budgets; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsections (1) and (4) of section 100.041, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsections (5) and (6) are added to that section to read:
- 100.041 Officers chosen at general election; officer-elect access to facilities.—
- (1) State senators shall be elected for terms of 4 years, those from odd-numbered districts in each year the number of which is a multiple of 4 and those from even-numbered districts in each even-numbered year the number of which is not a multiple of 4. Members of the House of Representatives shall be elected for terms of 2 years in each even-numbered year. In each county, a clerk of the circuit court, sheriff, superintendent of

schools, property appraiser, and tax collector shall be chosen by the qualified electors at the general election in each year the number of which is a multiple of 4. The Governor and the administrative officers of the executive branch of the state shall be elected for terms of 4 years in each even-numbered year the number of which is not a multiple of 4. Except as provided in subsection (5), the terms of state offices other than the terms of members of the Legislature shall begin on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January after said election. The term of office of each member of the Legislature shall begin upon election.

- (4) The term of office of each county and each district officer not otherwise provided by law shall commence on the Second first Tuesday after the first Monday in January following his or her election.
- (5) The term of office for a clerk of the circuit court, sheriff, superintendent of schools, property appraiser, and tax collector shall commence on the first Tuesday in December.
- (6) A county constitutional officer-elect shall be granted full access to all facilities owned by the constitutional office to on the next business day after the officer-elect receives his or her certificate of election from the supervisor of elections.

 For the purposes of this section, the term "access to all facilities" includes copies of keys or access cards necessary for the officer-elect to begin the transition process.

Section 2. Subsection (5) of section 129.06, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

129.06 Execution and amendment of budget.-

- (5) (a) Any county constitutional officer whose budget is approved by the board of county commissioners, who has not been reelected to office or is not seeking reelection, shall be prohibited from making any budget amendments, transferring funds between itemized appropriations, or expending in a single month more than one-twelfth of any itemized approved appropriation, following the date he or she is eliminated as a candidate or October 1, whichever comes later, without approval of the board of county commissioners.
- (b) Any county constitutional officer whose budget is approved by the board of county commissioners and who is not seeking reelection shall be prohibited from making any budget amendments, transferring funds between itemized appropriations, or expending in a single month more than one-twelfth of any itemized approved appropriation on or after October 1 of the year in which the election is held without approval of the board of county commissioners.

Section 3. Subsection (5) of section 195.087, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 195.087 Property appraisers and tax collectors to submit budgets to Department of Revenue.—
 - (5)(a) Any property appraiser or tax collector whose

budget is approved by the Department of Revenue who has not been reelected to office or is not seeking reelection shall be prohibited from making any budget amendments, transferring funds between itemized appropriations, or expending in a single month more than one-twelfth of any itemized approved appropriation following the date he or she is eliminated as a candidate or October 1, whichever comes later, without the approval of the Department of Revenue.

(b) Any property appraiser or tax collector whose budget is approved by the Department of Revenue and who is not seeking reelection shall be prohibited from making any budget amendments, transferring funds between itemized appropriations, or expending in a single month more than one-twelfth of any itemized approved appropriation on or after October 1 of the year in which the election is held without the approval of the Department of Revenue.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
