35 <u>2. The department shall adopt rules to streamline the</u> 36 <u>licensure application process for a licensed foster parent who</u> 37 <u>is in good standing and relocates within this state. These rules</u> 38 <u>must include, but are not limited to, rules concerning priority</u> 39 <u>review of applications, expedited home studies and background</u> 40 <u>checks, and recognition of prior foster parent training</u> 41 <u>coursework.</u>

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Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2025.

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
