47	Section 2. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the sum of
48	\$1,725,423 in recurring funds is appropriated from the General
49	Revenue Fund to the Department of Commerce, and 10 full-time
50	equivalent positions with the associated salary rate of 800,000
51	are authorized for the purpose of implementing this act. From
52	these funds, \$1.1 million is appropriated in the Salaries and
53	Benefits appropriation category, \$465,423 in the expense
54	category, and \$150,000 in contracted services. The funds must be
55	used for the department's duties in enforcing the provisions of
56	ss. 448.09, 448.095, 692.203, and 692.204, Florida Statutes.
57	Section 3. If any provision of this act or its application
58	to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity

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59	does not affect other provisions or applications of this act
60	which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
61	application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
62	severable.
63	Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
