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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to combatting illegal immigration, terrorist organizations, and transnational organized crime and their illegal immigrant participants; amending s. 874.02, F.S.; revising legislative findings and intent; amending s. 874.03, F.S.; revising the definition of the term "criminal gang" and defining the term "transnational criminal organization"; creating s. 874.041, F.S.; authorizing the penalty enhancement of certain offenses upon a finding by the factfinder that the defendant committed the charged offense for specified purposes; providing applicability; creating s. 874.081, F.S.; specifying that all profits, proceeds, and instrumentalities of hate group activity, terrorist organization activity, and transnational criminal organization activity and all property used or intended or attempted to be used to facilitate such criminal activity are subject to seizure and forfeiture under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act; creating s. 874.105, F.S.; providing criminal penalties for persons who knowingly initiate, organize, plan, finance, direct, manage, or supervise a hate group's activities, terrorist organization's activities, or transnational criminal organization's activities; providing for severability; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsections (1), (2), and (3) of section 874.02, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

874.02 Legislative findings and intent.-

- (1) The Legislature finds that it is the right of every person, regardless of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, or handicap, to be secure and protected from fear, intimidation, and physical harm caused by the activities of criminal gangs, transnational criminal organizations, terrorist organizations, and their members. It is not the intent of this chapter to interfere with the exercise of the constitutionally protected rights of freedom of expression and association. The Legislature recognizes the constitutional right of every citizen to harbor and express beliefs on any lawful subject whatsoever, to lawfully associate with others who share similar beliefs, to petition lawfully constituted authority for a redress of perceived grievances, and to participate in the electoral process.
- (2) The Legislature finds, however, that the state is facing a mounting crisis caused by criminal gangs, transnational criminal organizations, and terrorist organizations whose members threaten and terrorize peaceful citizens and commit a multitude of crimes. The These criminal gang activities such organizations engage in, both individually and collectively, present a clear and present danger. Street gangs, transnational criminal organizations, terrorist organizations, and hate groups have evolved into increasingly sophisticated and complex organized crime groups in their criminal tactics, schemes, and brutality. The state has a compelling interest in preventing criminal gang activity and halting the real and present danger

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posed by the proliferation of <u>such</u> criminal <u>organizations</u> gangs and the graduation from more primitive forms of criminal gangs to highly sophisticated criminal gangs. For these reasons, the Legislature finds that the provisions of this chapter are essential to maintain public order and safety.

(3) It is the intent of the Legislature to outlaw certain conduct associated with the existence and proliferation of <u>such</u> criminal <u>organizations</u> gangs, provide enhanced criminal penalties, and eliminate the patterns, profits, proceeds, instrumentalities, and property facilitating criminal <u>organizations</u> gang activity, including criminal gang recruitment.

Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 874.03, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (8) is added to that section, to read:

874.03 Definitions.—As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Criminal gang" means a formal or informal ongoing organization, association, or group that has as one of its primary activities the commission of criminal or delinquent acts, and that consists of three or more persons who have a common name or common identifying signs, colors, or symbols, including, but not limited to, terrorist organizations and hate groups.
- (a) As used in this subsection, "ongoing" means that the organization was in existence during the time period charged in a petition, information, indictment, or action for civil injunctive relief.
- (b) As used in this subsection, "primary activities" means that a criminal gang spends a substantial amount of time engaged

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in such activity, although such activity need not be the only, or even the most important, activity in which the criminal gang engages.

"Transnational criminal organization" refers to a group, network, or associated individuals who operate transnationally for the purpose of obtaining power, influence, or monetary or commercial gain, wholly or in part by illegal means, while advancing their activities through a pattern of crime, corruption, or violence, and while protecting their illegal activities through a transnational organizational structure and the exploitation of public corruption or transnational logistics and financial or communication mechanisms. The term includes, but is not limited to, organizations designated or that become designated in the future by Presidential Executive Order or by the United States Department of the Treasury, Office of Foreign Asset Control, including Presidential Executive Orders 12978 and 13581, the Foreign Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act, the International Emergency Economic Powers Act, or the National Emergencies Act, as either a transnational criminal organization or a foreign narcotics trafficker.

Section 3. Section 874.041, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

874.041 Hate group-, terrorist organization-, and transnational criminal organization-related offenses; enhanced penalties.—Upon a finding by the factfinder that the defendant committed the charged offense for the purpose of benefitting, promoting, or furthering the interests of a hate group, terrorist organization, or transnational criminal organization,

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the penalty for a misdemeanor or felony, or any delinquent act
or violation of law which would be a misdemeanor or felony if
committed by an adult, may be enhanced. Penalty enhancement
affects the applicable statutory maximum penalty only. Each of
the findings required as a basis for such sentence must be found
beyond a reasonable doubt. The enhancement is as follows:

- (1) (a) A misdemeanor of the second degree may be punished as if it were a misdemeanor of the first degree.
- (b) A misdemeanor of the first degree may be punished as if it were a felony of the third degree. For purposes of sentencing under chapter 921 and determining incentive gain-time eligibility under chapter 944, such offense is ranked in level 1 of the offense severity ranking chart. The criminal gang multiplier in s. 921.0024 does not apply to a misdemeanor offense enhanced under this subsection.
- (2)(a) A felony of the third degree may be punished as if it were a felony of the second degree.
- (b) A felony of the second degree may be punished as if it were a felony of the first degree.
- (c) A felony of the first degree may be punished as if it were a life felony.

For purposes of sentencing under chapter 921 and determining incentive gain-time eligibility under chapter 944, such felony offense is ranked as provided in s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023, and without regard to the penalty enhancement in this subsection.

Section 4. Section 874.081, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

874.081 Hate group, terrorist organization, and

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transnational criminal organization activity; forfeiture.—All profits, proceeds, and instrumentalities of hate group activity, terrorist organization activity, and transnational criminal organization activity and all property used or intended or attempted to be used to facilitate the criminal activity of any hate group, terrorist organization, or transnational criminal organization or of any member of such group or organization are subject to seizure and forfeiture under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act in chapter 932.

Section 5. Section 874.105, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

874.105 Directing the activities of a hate group, terrorist organization, or transnational criminal organization.—A person who knowingly initiates, organizes, plans, finances, directs, manages, or supervises a hate group's activities, terrorist organization's activities, or transnational criminal organization's activities commits a felony of the first degree, punishable by imprisonment for a term of years not exceeding life or as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 6. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of this act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.

Section 7. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
