Section 25. Subsection (1) of section 908.104, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

908.104 Cooperation with federal immigration authorities.-

(1) Except as provided in s. 908.1041, a law enforcement agency shall use best efforts to support the enforcement of federal immigration law. This subsection applies to an official, representative, agent, or employee of the entity or agency only

when he or she is acting within the scope of his or her official duties or within the scope of his or her employment.

Section 26. Section 908.1041, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

908.1041 Prohibition against engaging in immigration enforcement activities near public schools or religious institutions.-

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Immigration enforcement activities" means any action by a law enforcement officer or agency, including, but not limited to, the identification, detention, questioning, investigation, or arrest of individuals based on their immigration status.
- (b) "Public school" means any facility or location providing primary or secondary education, including, but not limited to, public K-12 schools, charter schools, and school grounds.
- (c) "Religious institution" means any building or space primarily used for religious worship or practices, including, but not limited to, churches, synagogues, mosques, temples, and other places of religious gatherings.
- (2) A law enforcement agency, officer, or sheriff's deputy may not engage in or cooperate with immigration enforcement activities or engage in or cooperate with immigration enforcement activities pursuant to the Unauthorized Alien Transport Program under s. 908.13 within 500 feet of any public school or religious institution, except in cases of exigent circumstances where immediate action is necessary to prevent harm or death. A local law enforcement agency may not:

- (a) Use agency resources, personnel, or authority to question, detain, or arrest individuals solely based on their immigration status on the grounds of, or within 500 feet of, a public school or religious institution.
- (b) Collaborate with federal immigration agency authorities for immigration enforcement purposes within or around the areas described in this subsection unless authorized to do so by a court with jurisdiction over the matter.
- (3) This section does not prohibit a local law enforcement agency from engaging in activities related to criminal investigations, emergency responses, or school safety as authorized by law, provided such activities do not involve immigration enforcement activities.
- (4) Within 30 days after the effective date of this act, each local law enforcement agency shall submit a report to the Department of Law Enforcement detailing policies and protocols for compliance with this section, including training protocols for officers.
- (5) A local law enforcement agency or officer who violates this section may be subject to disciplinary action by the local governmental entity, including suspension, dismissal, or loss of funding for local enforcement efforts.
- Section 27. The Division of Law Revision is directed to replace the phrase "the effective date of this act" with the date this act becomes a law.

908.104, F.S.; conforming a provision to changes made by the act; creating s. 908.1041, F.S.; defining terms; prohibiting local law enforcement agencies or officers from engaging in or cooperating with immigration enforcement activities or engaging in or cooperating with immigration enforcement activities pursuant to the Unauthorized Alien Transport Program within a specified distance of public schools or religious institutions; providing an exception; requiring law enforcement agencies to submit a report to the Department of Law Enforcement within a specified timeframe; providing requirements for the report; providing for disciplinary action; providing a directive to the Division of Law Revision; creating s. 908.1042, F.S.;
