**Amendment**

6 Remove lines 21-80 and insert:

7 life-threatening emergency event at a Level 1, Level 2, or  
8 Pediatric Trauma Center when delegated to perform such task:

9 (a) The pharmacist has completed an accredited  
10 postgraduate residency training program; or  
11 (b) The pharmacist has completed at least 3 years of  
12 direct patient care in a hospital setting.

14 A trauma center that permits a physician to delegate the  
15 administration of medication to a pharmacist must maintain  
16 records pursuant to s. 395.0197(5) including, but not limited

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17 to, documentation that the administering pharmacist meets the  
18 requirements of this section.

19 (2) The board shall adopt rules to administer this  
20 section.

21 **Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section**  
22 **395.0197, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:**

23 395.0197 Internal risk management program.—

24 (1) Every licensed facility shall, as a part of its  
25 administrative functions, establish an internal risk management  
26 program that includes all of the following components:

27 (b) The development of appropriate measures to minimize  
28 the risk of adverse incidents to patients, including, but not  
29 limited to:

30 1. Risk management and risk prevention education and  
31 training of all nonphysician personnel as follows:

32 a. Such education and training of all nonphysician  
33 personnel as part of their initial orientation; and

34 b. At least 1 hour of such education and training annually  
35 for all personnel of the licensed facility working in clinical  
36 areas and providing patient care, except those persons licensed  
37 as health care practitioners who are required to complete  
38 continuing education coursework pursuant to chapter 456 or the  
39 respective practice act.

40 2. A prohibition, except when emergency circumstances  
41 require otherwise, against a staff member of the licensed

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42 facility attending a patient in the recovery room, unless the  
43 staff member is authorized to attend the patient in the recovery  
44 room and is in the company of at least one other person.

45 However, a licensed facility is exempt from the two-person  
46 requirement if it has:

- 47 a. Live visual observation;
- 48 b. Electronic observation; or
- 49 c. Any other reasonable measure taken to ensure patient  
50 protection and privacy.

51 3. A prohibition against an unlicensed person from  
52 assisting or participating in any surgical procedure unless the  
53 facility has authorized the person to do so following a  
54 competency assessment, and such assistance or participation is  
55 done under the direct and immediate supervision of a licensed  
56 physician and is not otherwise an activity that may only be  
57 performed by a licensed health care practitioner.

58 4. Development, implementation, and ongoing evaluation of  
59 procedures, protocols, and systems to accurately identify  
60 patients, planned procedures, and the correct site of the  
61 planned procedure so as to minimize the performance of a  
62 surgical procedure on the wrong patient, a wrong surgical  
63 procedure, a wrong-site surgical procedure, or a surgical  
64 procedure otherwise unrelated to the patient's diagnosis or  
65 medical condition.
