7 **Section 2. Subsection (21) of section 1001.42, Florida**

8 **Statutes, is amended to read:**

9 1001.42 Powers and duties of district school board.—The
10 district school board, acting as a board, shall exercise all
11 powers and perform all duties listed below:

12 (21) EDUCATIONAL EMERGENCY.—To free schools that have with
13 a school grade of "D" or "F" or a persistently low performing
14 school as described in s. 1002.333 from contract restrictions
15 that limit the school school's district's ability to implement
16 programs and strategies needed to improve student performance, a

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district school board may adopt salary incentives or other strategies that address the selection, placement, compensation, and expectations of instructional personnel and provide principals with the autonomy described in s. 1012.28(8). For purposes of this subsection, an educational emergency exists in a school district if one or more schools in the district have a school grade of "D" or "F-" or a persistently low performing school as described in s. 1002.333. Notwithstanding chapter 447, relating to collective bargaining, a district school board may:

(a) Provide salary incentives that differentiate based on a teacher's certification, subject area taught, or grade level taught. Such incentives are not subject to collective bargaining requirements.

(b) Notwithstanding s. 1012.2315, relating to assignment of teachers, adopt strategies to assign high-quality teachers more equitably across schools in the district to low-performing schools as a management right. Such strategies are not subject to collective bargaining requirements.

Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 1001.452, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1001.452 District and school advisory councils.—

(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—

(a) The district school board shall establish an advisory council for each school in the district and shall develop procedures for the election and appointment of advisory council

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42 members. Each school advisory council shall include in its name
43 the words "school advisory council." The school advisory council
44 shall be the sole body responsible for final decisionmaking at
45 the school relating to implementation of ss. 1001.42(18) and
46 1008.345. A majority of the members of each school advisory
47 council must be persons who are not employed by the school
48 district. Each advisory council shall be composed of the
49 principal and an appropriately balanced number of teachers,
50 education support employees, students, parents, and other
51 business and community citizens ~~who are representative of the~~
52 ~~ethnic, racial, and economic community served by the school.~~
53 Career center and high school advisory councils shall include
54 students, and middle and junior high school advisory councils
55 may include students. School advisory councils of career centers
56 and adult education centers are not required to include parents
57 as members. Council members representing teachers, education
58 support employees, students, and parents shall be elected by
59 their respective peer groups at the school in a fair and
60 equitable manner as follows:

- 61 1. Teachers shall be elected by teachers.
- 62 2. Education support employees shall be elected by
63 education support employees.
- 64 3. Students shall be elected by students.
- 65 4. Parents shall be elected by parents.

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67 The district school board shall establish procedures to be
68 used by schools in selecting business and community members
69 which include means of ensuring wide notice of vacancies and of
70 taking input on possible members from local business, chambers
71 of commerce, community and civic organizations and groups, and
72 the public at large. The district school board shall review the
73 membership composition of each advisory council. ~~If the district~~
74 ~~school board determines that the membership elected by the~~
75 ~~school is not representative of the ethnic, racial, and economic~~
76 ~~community served by the school, the district school board must~~
77 ~~appoint additional members to achieve proper representation.~~
78 Although schools are strongly encouraged to establish school
79 advisory councils, the district school board of any school
80 district that has a student population of 10,000 or less may
81 establish a district advisory council which includes at least
82 one duly elected teacher from each school in the district. For
83 the purposes of school advisory councils and district advisory
84 councils, the term "teacher" includes classroom teachers,
85 certified student services personnel, and media specialists. For
86 purposes of this paragraph, the term "education support
87 employee" means any person employed by a school who is not
88 defined as instructional or administrative personnel pursuant to
89 s. 1012.01 and whose duties require 20 or more hours in each
90 normal working week.
