Such activity may be mechanically detected by seismographic monitoring or other means within a radius of up to 3 miles from the point of origin.
- (4) "Limestone mining operation" means the extraction and processing of limestone for use in concrete aggregate which results in ground vibrations.
- (5) "Property damage" means any physical damage to a structure, a foundation, or property caused by ground vibrations or a related impact resulting from limestone mining operations.
- (6) "Property owner" means an individual or entity holding title to real property in this state.

Section 3. Section 552.4452, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 552.4452 Claims; statute of limitations.-
- (1) A property owner whose property is located within a 3 mile radius of limestone mining operations who has sustained property damage as a result of such operations has the right to file a claim for compensation.
