20 conspires to provide material support or resources to
21 a domestic terrorist organization commits a specified
22 crime; amending s. 775.34, F.S.; defining the term
23 "domestic terrorist organization"; providing that a
24 person who willfully becomes a member of a domestic

32 | Domestic Security to designate an organization a
33 | domestic terrorist organization or a foreign terrorist
34 | organization if certain requirements are met;
35 | requiring the Chief to maintain a list of such

37 | designation within a specified time period; requiring
38 | the Chief to provide specified written notice to the
39 | Governor and the Cabinet within a certain time period
40 | before making the designation; providing the Governor
41 | and the Cabinet may by a majority vote approve or
42 | reject the designation; requiring the Chief to publish

64 for domestic terrorist organizations or foreign
65 terrorist organizations; authorizing the withholding

67 s. 1006.61, F.S.; requiring public postsecondary
68 educational institutions to report specified
69 information of a student in certain circumstances;
70 requiring immediate expulsion of such student from the
71 institution; amending s. 1009.01, F.S.; providing
72 definitions; amending ss. 1009.23 and 1009.24, F.S.;
73 requiring that certain students of Florida College
74 System institutions and state universities be
75 immediately expelled and assessed out-of-state fees

76 after a determination has been made such students have
 77 promoted a domestic terrorist organization or a
 78 foreign terrorist organization; amending s. 1009.26,
 79 F.S.; providing that certain students of school
 80 districts and Florida College System institutions are
 81 ineligible for specified fee waivers; creating s.
 82 1009.8963, F.S.; prohibiting students who promote
 83 domestic terrorist organization or foreign terrorist
 84 organizations from being awarded certain public
 85 institution funds; providing an effective date.

 87 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the United States and
 88 Florida Constitutions guarantee the free exercise of religion
 89 and that the United States and the State of Florida have a long
 90 and cherished history of protecting religious freedom, and

91 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has acknowledged
 92 that the United States Constitution does not prohibit public
 93 authorities from regulating conduct or actions, even if
 94 motivated by religion, that "have invariably posed *some*
 95 *substantial threat to public safety, peace or order,*" *Sherbert*
 96 *v. Verner*, 374 U.S. 398, 403 (1963), and

97 WHEREAS, Section 3, Article I of the State Constitution
 98 provides that "[r]eligious freedom shall not justify practices
 99 inconsistent with public morals, peace or safety," and

100 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that certain practices

101 inherent to Sharia law, including nonconsensual and child
 102 marriages, public stoning or lashings, physical warfare against
 103 non-Muslims, discriminatory treatment of women, and amputation
 104 of limbs for crimes such as theft, violate the fundamental
 105 rights of persons, undermine the peace and order of society, and
 106 are deeply incompatible with the United States and Florida
 107 Constitutions, and

108 WHEREAS, the Legislature has determined that a public or
 109 private authority or tribunal in the State of Florida should not
 110 enforce any religious practice, including any practice of Sharia
 111 law, that violates legal rights, NOW, THEREFORE,

113 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

114

115 **Section 1. Section 2.05, Florida Statutes, is created to**
 116 **read:**

117 2.05 Application of religious or foreign law.—

118 (1) For purposes of this section, the term:

119 (a) "Foreign law" means a legal code or formal system of
 120 law of a foreign country or nation, or of an international
 121 organization.

122 (b) "Religious law" means a legal code or formal system of
 123 law that is associated with a religion and is based on the
 124 sacred texts or traditions of such religion. The term includes
 125 Sharia law.

126 (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the terms "foreign
127 law" and "religious law" do not include the following:

128 (a) The natural law or natural rights, as such law or
129 rights are understood within the legal tradition of the United
130 States or this state.

131 (b) A provision of the United States Constitution or a
132 constitution of one of the several states.

133 (c) A provision of federal or state law.

134 (d) The common law, including the common law as described
135 in s. 2.01.

136 (e) A provision of law of a Native American tribe within a
137 state or territory of the United States.

138 (3) A court, administrative law judge, hearing officer,
139 agency, arbitration panel, or any other authority or tribunal
140 established by law or agreement of the parties may not enforce a
141 provision of religious law or foreign law between any person and
142 the state or its agencies, political subdivisions, or
143 municipalities unless the enforcement of such provision is
144 required by federal or state law. However, in no event may such
145 provision be enforced against a person if such enforcement would
146 violate a constitutional right of such person under the United
147 States Constitution or the Florida Constitution.

148 (4) A court, administrative law judge, hearing officer,
149 agency, arbitration panel, or any other authority or tribunal
150 established by law or agreement of the parties may not enforce

151 any provision of religious law or foreign law in any matter or
 152 case between private persons, notwithstanding any contractual
 153 agreement between them, if the enforcement of such provision
 154 would violate the rights of any person under federal or state
 155 law. However, such provision may be enforced if such enforcement
 156 is required by the United States Constitution or the Florida
 157 Constitution.

158 (5) This section does not apply to the governance,
 159 administration, or adjudication of ecclesiastical matters of a
 160 religious organization, including, but not limited to:

161 (a) The selection, appointment, discipline, or removal of
 162 employees or clergy.

163 (b) The interpretation of doctrine.

164 **Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 617.1420, Florida**
 165 **Statutes, is amended to read:**

166 617.1420 Grounds for administrative dissolution.—

167 (1) The Department of State may commence a proceeding
 168 under s. 617.1421 to administratively dissolve a corporation if:

169 (a) The corporation has failed to file its annual report
 170 and pay the annual report filing fee by 5 p.m. Eastern Time on
 171 the third Friday in September;

172 (b) The corporation is without a registered agent or
 173 registered office in this state for 30 days or more;

174 (c) The corporation does not notify the Department of
 175 State within 30 days after its registered agent or registered

176 office has been changed, after its registered agent has
 177 resigned, or after its registered office has been discontinued;

178 (d) The corporation has failed to answer truthfully and
 179 fully, within the time prescribed by this act, interrogatories
 180 propounded by the Department of State; ~~or~~

181 (e) The corporation's period of duration stated in its
 182 articles of incorporation has expired; or

183 (f) The corporation has been designated as a domestic
 184 terrorist organization or foreign terrorist organization
 185 pursuant to s. 943.03102, such designation has been published in
 186 the Florida Administrative Register, and any timely judicial
 187 challenge under that section has been resolved against the
 188 organization.

189 **Section 3. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 775.30,**
 190 **Florida Statutes, are amended to read:**

191 775.30 Terrorism; defined; penalties.—

192 (1) As used in this chapter and the Florida Criminal Code,
 193 the term:

194 (a) terms "Terrorism" or "terrorist activity" means mean
 195 an activity that:

196 1.(a) Involves:

197 a.1. A violent act or an act dangerous to human life which
 198 is a violation of the criminal laws of this state or of the
 199 United States; or

200 b.2. A violation of s. 815.06; and

201 ~~2.(b)~~ Is intended to:
 202 ~~a.1.~~ Intimidate, injure, or coerce a civilian population;
 203 ~~b.2.~~ Influence the policy of a government by intimidation
 204 or coercion; or
 205 ~~c.3.~~ Affect the conduct of government through destruction
 206 of property, assassination, murder, kidnapping, or aircraft
 207 piracy.

208 (b) "Domestic terrorist organization" means an
 209 organization whose designation as such has been published in the
 210 Florida Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102.

211 (3) A person who violates ~~commits a violation of~~
 212 subsection (2) which results in death or serious bodily injury
 213 commits a life felony, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s.
 214 775.083, or s. 775.084. As used in this subsection, the term
 215 "serious bodily injury" means an injury to a person which
 216 creates a substantial risk of death, serious personal
 217 disfigurement, or protracted loss or impairment of the function
 218 of a bodily member or an organ.

219 **Section 4. Paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of subsection (1)**
 220 **of section 775.32, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as**
 221 **paragraphs (d), (e), and (f), respectively, subsections (2),**
 222 **(3), and (4) are amended, and a new paragraph (c) is added to**
 223 **subsection (1) of that section, to read:**

224 775.32 Use of military-type training provided by a
 225 ~~designated foreign terrorist organizations~~ organization.-

226 (1) As used in this section, the term:

227 (c) "Domestic terrorist organization" means an
 228 organization whose designation as such has been published in the
 229 Florida Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102.

230 (2) A person who has received military-type training from
 231 a designated foreign terrorist organization or a domestic
 232 terrorist organization may not use, attempt to use, or conspire
 233 to use such military-type training with the intent to unlawfully
 234 harm another person or damage a critical infrastructure
 235 facility.

236 (3) A person who violates ~~commits a violation of~~
 237 subsection (2) commits a felony of the second degree, punishable
 238 as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

239 (4) A person who violates ~~commits a violation of~~
 240 subsection (2) which results in the death of, or serious bodily
 241 injury to, a person commits a felony of the first degree,
 242 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

243 **Section 5. Paragraphs (b) through (e) of subsection (1) of**
 244 **section 775.33, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs**
 245 **(c) through (f), respectively, subsections (3) and (5) are**
 246 **amended, and a new paragraph (b) is added to subsection (1) of**
 247 **that section, to read:**

248 775.33 Providing material support or resources for
 249 terrorism or to terrorist organizations.—

250 (1) As used in this section, the term:

251 (b) "Domestic terrorist organization" means an
252 organization whose designation as such has been published in the
253 Florida Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102.

254 (3) A person who knowingly provides material support or
255 resources to a designated foreign terrorist organization or a
256 domestic terrorist organization, or attempts or conspires to do
257 so, commits a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided
258 in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. To violate this
259 subsection, a person must have knowledge that the organization
260 is a designated foreign terrorist organization or a domestic
261 terrorist organization, or that the organization has engaged in
262 or engages in terrorism or terrorist activity.

263 (5) (a) For purposes of prosecution under subsection (2) or
264 subsection (3), a person is deemed to provide material support
265 or resources by providing personnel if the person knowingly
266 provides, attempts to provide, or conspires to provide himself
267 or herself or another person to:

268 1. Work under the direction and control of a designated
269 foreign terrorist organization or a domestic terrorist
270 organization, or a person engaged in, or intending to engage in,
271 an act of terrorism; or

272 2. Organize, manage, supervise, or otherwise direct the
273 operations of a designated foreign terrorist organization or a
274 domestic terrorist organization, or a person engaged in, or
275 intending to engage in, an act of terrorism.

276 (b) An individual who acts entirely independently of the
277 designated foreign terrorist organization or a domestic
278 terrorist organization, or the person engaged in, or intending
279 to engage in, an act of terrorism to advance the organization's
280 or person's goals or objectives is not working under the
281 direction and control of the designated foreign terrorist
282 organization or domestic terrorist organization or person
283 engaged in, or intending to engage in, an act of terrorism.

284 **Section 6. Section 775.34, Florida Statutes, is amended to**
285 **read:**

286 775.34 Membership in a ~~designated foreign~~ terrorist
287 organizations ~~organization~~.

288 (1) As used in this section, the term:

289 (a) "Designated foreign terrorist organization" has the
290 same meaning as provided in s. 775.32.

291 (b) "Domestic terrorist organization" means an
292 organization whose designation as such has been published in the
293 Florida Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102.

294 (2) A person who willfully becomes a member of a
295 designated foreign terrorist organization or a domestic
296 terrorist organization and serves under the direction or control
297 of that organization with the intent to further the illegal acts
298 of the organization commits a felony of the second degree,
299 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
300 ~~As used in this section, the term "designated foreign terrorist~~

301 ~~organization" has the same meaning as provided in s. 775.32.~~

302 **Section 7. Subsection (7) of section 874.03, Florida**
 303 **Statutes, is amended to read:**

304 874.03 Definitions.—As used in this chapter:

305 (7) "Terrorist organization" means any organized group
 306 engaged in or organized for the purpose of engaging in terrorism
 307 as defined in s. 775.30. The term includes:

308 (a) A domestic terrorist organization whose designation as
 309 such has been published in the Florida Administrative Register
 310 in accordance with s. 943.03102.

311 (b) A foreign terrorist organization whose designation as
 312 such has been published in the Florida Administrative Register
 313 in accordance with s. 943.03102.

314
 315 This definition does not ~~shall not be construed to~~ prevent
 316 prosecution under this chapter of individuals acting alone.

317 **Section 8. Section 943.03102, Florida Statutes, is created**
 318 **to read:**

319 943.03102 Designation of terrorist organizations.—

320 (1) (a) In order to ensure the safety of this state, and
 321 the safety of the residents of this state, the Chief of Domestic
 322 Security may designate an organization:

323 1. A domestic terrorist organization if the Chief of
 324 Domestic Security finds that the organization meets the
 325 following criteria:

326 a. The organization is based or operates in this state or
327 the United States.

328 b. The organization is engaging in terrorist activity as
329 defined in s. 775.30.

330 c. The terrorist activity of the organization is an
331 ongoing threat to the security of this state or the United
332 States.

333 2. A foreign terrorist organization if the Chief of
334 Domestic Security finds that the organization meets the
335 following criteria:

336 a. The organization is designated as a foreign terrorist
337 organization by the United States Secretary of State pursuant to
338 s. 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

339 b. The terrorist activity of the organization is an
340 ongoing threat to the security of this state or the United
341 States.

342 (b) The Chief of Domestic Security must maintain a list of
343 organizations that he or she designates as domestic terrorist
344 organizations or foreign terrorist organizations.

345 (c) At least once every 5 years, the Chief of Domestic
346 Security must review each designation made under paragraph (a)
347 which labels an organization a domestic terrorist organization
348 or a foreign terrorist organization.

349 (2) (a) At least seven days before making a designation
350 under subsection (1), the Chief of Domestic Security must

351 provide written notice to the Governor and Cabinet of his or her
352 intent to designate an organization as a domestic terrorist
353 organization or a foreign terrorist organization, which notice
354 must be accompanied by written findings regarding the basis for
355 such designation.

356 (b) Upon receipt of written notice made pursuant to
357 paragraph (a), the Governor and Cabinet may, by a majority vote,
358 approve or reject a designation made by the Chief of Domestic
359 Security under subsection (1).

360 (c) Within seven days after approval by the Governor and
361 Cabinet of a designation made by the Chief of Domestic Security
362 under subsection (1), the Chief of Domestic Security must
363 publish notice of the designation in the Florida Administrative
364 Register.

365 (d) Within 30 days after publication of a notice of the
366 designation in the Florida Administrative Register, the
367 organization designated as a domestic terrorist organization or
368 a foreign terrorist organization, or any member of such
369 organization, may challenge such designation in the circuit
370 court of the Second Judicial Circuit in and for Leon County.

371 (3) (a) An organization designated as a domestic terrorist
372 organization or a foreign terrorist organization may petition
373 the department, at any time, for the removal of such
374 designation.

375 (b) At any time, the Governor and Cabinet may remove, by a

376 majority vote, a designation made by the Chief of Domestic
 377 Security under subsection (1).

378 (4) A state agency, political subdivision, or public
 379 school district authorized to expend state-appropriated funds or
 380 levy ad valorem taxes may not:

381 (a) Expend such funds or taxes to support a foreign
 382 terrorist organization or a domestic terrorist organization, or
 383 a member of such organization, whose designation as such has
 384 been published in the Florida Administrative Register in
 385 accordance with this section.

386 (b) Accept any funds from a foreign terrorist organization
 387 or a domestic terrorist organization, or a member of such
 388 organization, whose designation as such has been published in
 389 the Florida Administrative Register in accordance with this
 390 section.

391 (5) The department shall adopt rules to implement this
 392 section.

393 **Section 9. Paragraph (t) is added to subsection (1) of**
 394 **section 1002.421, Florida Statutes, to read:**

395 1002.421 State school choice scholarship program
 396 accountability and oversight.—

397 (1) PRIVATE SCHOOL ELIGIBILITY AND OBLIGATIONS.—A private
 398 school participating in an educational scholarship program
 399 established pursuant to this chapter must be a private school as
 400 defined in s. 1002.01 in this state, be registered, and be in

401 compliance with all requirements of this section in addition to
 402 private school requirements outlined in s. 1002.42, specific
 403 requirements identified within respective scholarship program
 404 laws, and other provisions of Florida law that apply to private
 405 schools, and must:

406 (t) Prohibit:

- 407 1. Employment of or contracting with;
- 408 2. Ownership or operation by; and
- 409 3. Acceptance of funds from

410
 411 a person or entity that is affiliated with or in any way
 412 controlled by:

413 a. A foreign terrorist organization whose designation as
 414 such has been published in the Florida Administrative Register
 415 in accordance with s. 943.03102, or a member of such
 416 organization;

417 b. A criminal gang or a criminal gang member as defined in
 418 s. 874.03;

419 c. A terrorist organization as defined in s. 874.03;

420 d. A transnational crime organization, as defined in s.
 421 874.03, or a member of such organization;

422 e. A domestic terrorist organization as defined in s.
 423 775.32;

424 f. A person or entity that has:

425 (I) Provided material support or resources, as defined in

426 s. 775.33(1), to; or
427 (II) Received such support or resources from
428
429 a foreign terrorist organization whose designation as such has
430 been published in the Florida Administrative Register in
431 accordance with s. 943.03102, or a criminal gang, terrorist
432 organization, transnational crime organization, or domestic
433 terrorist organization, as those terms are defined in s. 874.03;
434 g. A person or entity that has demonstrated a pattern or
435 practice of supporting or advocating for terrorism as defined in
436 s. 775.30(1);
437 h. A school program or student group that promotes a
438 domestic terrorist organization or a foreign terrorist
439 organization whose designation as such has been published in the
440 Florida Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102;
441 or
442 i. A school program or student group that promotes a
443 person or entity providing material support, as defined in s.
444 775.33, to a domestic terrorist organization or a foreign
445 terrorist organization whose designation as such has been
446 published in the Florida Administrative Register in accordance
447 with s. 943.03102.
448
449 The department shall suspend the payment of funds to a private
450 school that knowingly fails to comply with this subsection, and

451 shall prohibit the school from enrolling new scholarship
452 students, for 1 fiscal year and until the school complies. If a
453 private school fails to meet the requirements of this subsection
454 or has consecutive years of material exceptions listed in the
455 report required under paragraph (q), the commissioner may
456 determine that the private school is ineligible to participate
457 in a scholarship program.

458 **Section 10. Section 1003.035, Florida Statutes, is created**
459 **to read:**

460 1003.035 Prohibited expenditures.—A public school,
461 including a charter school, school district, charter school
462 administrator, or direct-support organization for any such
463 school or school district may not expend any state or federal
464 funds to promote, support, or maintain any programs or campus
465 activities that:

466 (1) Promote a domestic terrorist organization or a foreign
467 terrorist organization whose designation as such has been
468 published in the Florida Administrative Register in accordance
469 with s. 943.03102.

470 (2) Promote a person or entity providing material support,
471 as defined in s. 775.33, to a domestic terrorist organization or
472 a foreign terrorist organization whose designation as such has
473 been published in the Florida Administrative Register in
474 accordance with s. 943.03102.

475 **Section 11. Subsection (2) of section 1004.06, Florida**

476 **Statutes, is amended to read:**

477 1004.06 Prohibited expenditures.—

478 (2) (a) A Florida College System institution, state
 479 university, Florida College System institution direct-support
 480 organization, or state university direct-support organization
 481 may not expend any state or federal funds to promote, support,
 482 or maintain any programs or campus activities that:

483 1. ~~(a)~~ Violate s. 1000.05; ~~or~~

484 2. ~~(b)~~ Advocate for diversity, equity, and inclusion, or
 485 promote or engage in political or social activism, as defined by
 486 rules of the State Board of Education and regulations of the
 487 Board of Governors; or

488 3. Promote a domestic terrorist organization or a foreign
 489 terrorist organization whose designation as such has been
 490 published in the Florida Administrative Register in accordance
 491 with s. 943.03102.

492 (b) The State Board of Education or the Board of
 493 Governors, as applicable, may withhold performance-based funding
 494 of a Florida College System institution or state university that
 495 violates subparagraph (a)3.

496 (c) Student fees to support student-led organizations are
 497 allowed ~~permitted~~ notwithstanding any speech or expressive
 498 activity by such organizations which would otherwise violate
 499 this subsection, provided that the public funds must be
 500 allocated to student-led organizations pursuant to written

501 policies or regulations of each Florida College System
 502 institution or state university, as applicable. Use of
 503 institution facilities by student-led organizations is allowed
 504 ~~permitted~~ notwithstanding any speech or expressive activity by
 505 such organizations which would otherwise violate this
 506 subsection, provided that such use must be granted to student-
 507 led organizations pursuant to written policies or regulations of
 508 each Florida College System institution or state university, as
 509 applicable.

510 **Section 12. Subsection (3) is added to section 1006.61,**
 511 **Florida Statutes, to read:**

512 1006.61 Participation by students in disruptive
 513 activities, and promotion of foreign terrorist organizations, at
 514 public postsecondary educational institution; penalties.—

515 (3) (a) Pursuant to 8 C.F.R. s. 214.3(g) (2), a public
 516 postsecondary educational institution must report information
 517 relating to the current status of a student who is attending the
 518 institution on a student visa if the student promotes a foreign
 519 terrorist organization or a domestic terrorist organization
 520 whose designation as such has been published in the Florida
 521 Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102.

522 (b) After a student of a state institution of higher
 523 learning has been determined to have promoted a foreign
 524 terrorist organization or a domestic terrorist organization
 525 whose designation as such has been published in the Florida

526 Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102, such
527 student shall be immediately expelled from the institution.

528 **Section 13. Section 1009.01, Florida Statutes, is amended**
529 **to read:**

530 1009.01 Definitions.—The term:

531 (1) "Domestic terrorist organization" means an
532 organization whose designation as such has been published in the
533 Florida Administrative Register in accordance with s. 943.03102.

534 (2) "Foreign terrorist organization" means an organization
